#### From Our Principal...

We are in a time of change. The responses at Mass have changed. The political arena is seeking change. The economy needs to change. Through these changes, the mission of Teurlings Catholic High School has never changed.

As a witness to the needless death of unborn infants, Teurlings Catholic sent over forty students, teachers, and parents to the national Pro-Life March in Washington D.C. On campus we, along with our eighth grade guests from Sts. Leo-Seton, celebrated with a Pro-Life Liturgy as a visible sign of our support. The response from the students is a reflection of the spiritual formation at home and school bearing fruit.

Recently members of our Theology Department participated in a continuing education effort for catechist certification and certification maintenance at the Hofinger Conference held in New Orleans. In addition to the intellectual aspect of learning more about our faith, they are prepared to offer faith sharing opportunities to our students, faculty, and staff.

This February we celebrate Mardi Gras. As we all know, Mardi Gras marks the final day before the fast of Lent, a forty-day period of self-denial and abstinence. Lent is the season that prepares us for the Easter season, when Jesus died for our sins, was buried, and rose from the dead. Mardi Gras is the season of carnivals, parades, alcohol consumption, and overindulgence. I encourage you to put this event in proper perspective for your children and to help them better understand what the season of Lent is really about. Over the past few years during Mardi Gras, several area high school students have died in vehicular accidents as the result of alcohol. The response from students will be in direct proportion to the spiritual and behavioral formation at home and school.

#### TCH ADVISORY COUNCIL ELECTIONS - 2012-2013

The TCH Advisory Council serves in an advisory capacity to the Chancellor of Teurlings. The Council is responsible for presenting an annual operating budget and recommending policies for the school. Parents elect at-large Council Members, and the Priest from each TCH owner parish appoints a Member. Council terms require a three-year commitment (i.e..2012 – 2015)

This coming school year **two (2) vacancies** will exist. **One (1)** is a pastor appointed position to represent **St. Genevieve Church Parish. One (1)** is a member at-large position. All parents of TCH students may vote to elect the member at-large.

Nominees for the at-large position should be parents of children currently enrolled at TCH or accepted for admission and registered for the 2012 - 2013 school year. Nominees should be willing to make the necessary commitment of time to serve as an effective Council Member. The following individuals, and their spouses, are NOT eligible for Council membership:

Employees of the school;

Employees of an owner parish;

Persons who work at the school, but are paid for that work by another group, agency, individual, or school system.

Please submit a brief bio of yourself. Include the name of your spouse and children with your children's grade levels. Additional information to include: church parish, participation, community involvement, active interest in school activities and if you are a graduate of TCH. A statement regarding Catholic school experience would also be appreciated.

Please consider giving of yourself in service to the school as an Advisory Council Member.

#### **ACADEMICS**

It makes sense that students do better in their classes when the student attends classes regularly. Playing catch-up is never easy, especially if you are dealing with multiple classes and make-up tests, as well as material missed in class. It is much easier to understand how to work the math problem if you have watched the teacher do so on the promethean or whiteboard than it is to try and figure it out for yourself from the textbook. It is much easier to understand the hidden underlying theme in the novel when the teacher explains and points out examples than it is to read the book by yourself. It is much easier to learn the chemical theory through an experiment in class than it is to read someone else's notes.

As an accredited and stateapproved high school, Teurlings Catholic must follow state mandates when it comes to student attendance. The state sets the maximum number of times a student can miss class and still receive credit, based on the total number of days in the school year. Currently, that maximum number of absences in a school year is set at 17. It is expected to decrease next year. What that means is that a student who misses more than 17 days in a class cannot receive credit for the class - even if the student has an "A" in the class. It does not matter if the absences were "excused" or "unexcused" and a doctor's excuse does not waive the absence. According to the state, an absence is an absence, no matter the reason.

Allowances are made only for serious illness, surgery or injury requiring lengthy hospital stays or recuperation at home. Also, school activities do not count against the absence total (retreats, field trips, athletic contests, Beta convention, etc.), but college visits, recruiting visits and related activities are not excused absences. Although this limit may sound harsh, some parishes in Louisiana allow only 10 absences per class in a school year.

Letters were mailed out recently to the parents of all students who had 8 absences or more in any class as of January 19. Again, a letter does not mean the student will not receive credit, rather it is a reminder of the policy so parents can take appropriate action with their children.

Please encourage and help your student to limit absences. If the student is truly sick, we'd rather he or she was not here. It is to your student's advantage, however, to schedule dentist appointments, family vacations, and other activities outside of school hours. It is always better to be here and

listen to the teacher and get the information first-hand than it is to rely on second-hand sources such as another student's notes.

While we are on the subject of absences, just a reminder about the make-up policy. Students who are absent for one to three days are expected to take a missed test on the morning the student returns to school. Make-up tests are given at 6:30 AM Tuesday through Friday mornings. If a student is absent for longer than three days, the student is required to meet with the teacher on the first day back to discuss arrangements for making up work. Any student missing the day prior to a scheduled test is expected to take the test with the class if he/she returns to school on the scheduled test day. Finally, students are responsible for all work missed in classes, regardless of the length or reason for the absence. including all school-related absences.

- Attention seniors: Remember to complete your FAFSA form online at www.fafsa.ed.gov. This is the TOPS application and also the application for receiving any kind of federal or state aid for which you may qualify. Only students who complete this FAFSA and meet the TOPS requirements will receive the award. The deadline to complete the FAFSA is July 1, 2012, however I encourage you to complete the form by the end of April. You will need to include your tax information even though TOPS has nothing to do with family income. If you have any questions, please feel free to call me at 337 235-5711 ext. 108.
- Juniors need to apply to take the ACT test in April if they have not already done so. There are only two left this year and I encourage each Junior to take the ACT at least two times prior to their senior year.
