Application Process for Admission

The application process for new students the 2014-2015 school year takes place during the month of January. Visit our website, www.tchs.net, and click the Admissions tab for more information and to apply on-line. The deadline to apply is Friday, January 31, 2014.

IMPORTANT

Siblings of students currently enrolled at TCH must follow these same procedures and comply with the deadlines. All sections of the on-line application must be completed and all supplemental documentation must be uploaded. Failure to do so will result in the student's application being placed on hold, thereby delaying the admissions process, and the student will be placed in line with others in the wait pool. There is no application fee; registration fees are due at registration, following acceptance to TCH, March 10-14, 2014.

Due to the volume of applications, all deadlines will be strictly enforced.

REGISTRATION

Current TCH students are not required to re-apply for admissions but are required to register on Renweb during the week of March 10-14, 2014. It is mandatory that parents register their students within the specified dates to assure their enrollment status and to avoid the late penalty. More information about the registration process will be emailed to all accepted students and current TCH students on February 19, 2014. TCHS PLAN Scores, 2013

The results are in and our 10th graders excelled on the 2013 PLAN Test. As you can see from the chart, our 10th graders (the red score line) topped the national average in every category. Our ninth graders also took the 10th grade test and scored above the national 10th average in every category except math. As the test is designed to test 10th graders, it is assumed that students taking the test have already completed algebra and geometry, as well as two years of high school science, English and social studies. For our ninth graders to score above the national 10th grade average in English, reading, science, as well as the composite is accomplishment. In fact, our math score, considering that the students had just started the ninth grade, scoring less than a point below the national 10th grade average was also a good mark.

The scores were sent, so you should have your student's scores. So, what do the scores mean? In general, if your 10th grader takes the college-bound courses we require here at Teurlings and does the work as required, the PLAN score in 10th grade is a good indicator of where the student will score on the ACT as a senior. On the score report you received there will be a predicted ACT score. From my experience, a student who receives a 22 on the PLAN as a 10th grader has a good chance of earning a 24-25 on the

ACT; a student who has an 18 on the PLAN in 10th grade should get to the 20-21 level on the ACT; a student who earns a 25 on the PLAN in 10th grade would be predicted to earn a 27 or higher on the ACT senior year. Of course, the predictions, as noted above, are based on the student taking the proper courses AND doing the required work AND retaining the knowledge gained in the courses.


For ninth graders, the predictors could be even higher, since the score earned in ninth grade reflects 10th grade national norms.

How do we use the scores here at Teurlings? First, ninth grade scores are provided to our local Catholic elementary schools (Carencro Catholic, Holy Family, Immaculate Heart, St. Bernard, St. Cecilia, St. Genevieve, Sts. Leo-Seton, St. Ignatius, Trinity) at the request of their administrative teams so those

schools can continue to chart the progress of their students and the effectiveness of their curriculum. Those ninth grade scores really indicate the knowledge base brought students with them to Teurlings. Ninth graders will take the test again in April and we will use those April scores to chart progress for our ninth graders this year, so we can see what effect our curriculum and teaching methods have had.

PLAN scores are also currently used to qualify students at TCHS for honors courses and by LA Tech and ULL to qualify students for the dual enrollment program.

This is the last year that we will be using the PLAN Test (and that elementary schools will use their version, the Explore Test). Beginning in 2014, ACT has a new pre-ACT test called the ASPIRE that is aligned with the Common Core State Standards adopted by Louisiana and 46 other states. We piloted the new test last spring. It is a very different test from the current PLAN, EXPLORE and even ACT Test and we will be working to prepare our students for the new tests next year. ACT will also be modifying their test in future years, again to align with the Common Core State Standards.





- Attention Seniors: Beginning January 1st, you can complete the FAFSA form online at www.fafsa.ed.gov. This is the TOPS application and also the application for receiving any kind of federal or state aid for which you may qualify. Only students who complete this FAFSA and meet the TOPS requirements will receive the award. The deadline to complete the FAFSA is July 1, 2014, however I encourage you to complete the form by the end of April. You will need to include your tax information even though TOPS has nothing to do with family income. If you have any questions, please feel free to call Mrs. Proctor at 337 235-5711 ext. 108. You can also refer to the Senior information booklet that you received at the start of the school year.
- √ Juniors need to apply to take the ACT test in February if they have not already done so. There are only three tests left this year. I strongly encourage each Junior to take the ACT at least two times prior to their senior year.
- √ Watch for an upcoming email on our next ACT Prep class which will be offered towards the end of January, prior to the February ACT test date.
- √ The deadline for the UL Lafayette scholarship is January 31, 2014. To apply students must apply for admission and have a 3.0 GPA and a 23 composite on the ACT. Applications can be downloaded at www.louisiana.edu.
- ✓ All Practice ACT and Practice SAT scores have been distributed to 9th, 10th and 11th grade students. Please call the Guidance Office if you have any questions or concerns.
