From Our Principal...

e begin the month of March with Mardi Gras, Ash Wednesday, and the season of Lent. As Catholics, Lent is our great retreat. It is the time during which we reflect on our baptismal commitment and make changes where needed. I would encourage you, in this season of Lent, to spend time as a family to pray, play, and work together.

In Catholic schools throughout the Diocese of Lafayette, applications for admission are completed in the month of January for the following academic year. The number of applications exceeded available space and not everyone who sought Catholic education was admitted to Teurlings Catholic. We accepted 200 freshmen students for the 2014-2015 school year, and others were placed on a waiting list. To guarantee your child's enrollment, it is important to participate in the registration process by the March 14 deadline. Family situations change and those students on the wait list may have the opportunity to be enrolled.

We have so many things to celebrate as a school community. The Rebel Revue dance team competed in UDA's National Dance Team Championship in Orlando and placed 4th in the nation in Hip-Hop dance. The Rebel Cheerleaders placed 9th in the nation in UCA's National High School Cheerleading Championship in Orlando in their first entry into this elite competition. The Rebel spirit squads were also a national top ten squad to raise money for St. Jude's and have been awarded four expense paid trips to visit St. Jude's Children's Research Hospital. The Rebel Wrestling team was Division II State Runners-up. The boys' soccer team advanced to the regional playoffs and the girls to the state quarterfinals. The girls' and boys' basketball teams advanced to the Bi-District round of the state playoffs. The recent production of *Annie* was a record breaking attendance and was a very professional production. Senior Nick Miller has been chosen as the Diocese of Lafayette 12th Grade Student of the Year.

On March 19, at 12:00 p.m., we will celebrate the academic accomplishments of our students with the annual Academic Pep Rally. Join us in the Rebel Dome for the "GrAdest Show on Earth!" Special "performers" are traveling to 139 Teurlings Drive from all over the world.

We begin each Monday during the season of Lent with a student initiated spiritual observance of the meaning of Lent. This journey will take us to the senior class reenactment of the Passion of the Lord at sunrise on Holy Thursday. We have so much for which to be grateful. The lessons in our Christian life that we pass on as a school run much deeper than, "What did you give up for Lent?"

As a Catholic school, we continue to pray for all of the families affected in the tragic traffic accident on Hwy. 90. We pray for the four who lost their lives, we pray for the injured, we pray for family and friends at Lafayette High School and H. L. Bourgeois High School, we pray for the bus driver who may have saved many lives, and we pray for the first responders who quickly sought aid for the injured.

On February 13, **Ceata Hackett** attended a Lafayette Parish workshop to discuss curriculum changes in Algebra II.




