From Our Principal...

A child enters pre-K for their first day of school, uncertain what the future holds. School starts, school ends, and repeats often. Fourteen years later a senior graduates, uncertain what the future holds. Many of our senior graduates will soon leave home to go to college, never again to permanently reside in the family home. You can define "home" as a place where one lives; or the heart or center. Teurlings Catholic has been home for many of our seniors for the past four years, and for a few, a shorter time. We at Teurlings Catholic have embraced the legal term, *in loco parentis*, in place of the parents.

Students at school are akin to family members dwelling at home. They are characterized by certain virtues and values. One must have self-discipline to make the right choices, not what peer pressure dictates, but what one knows in his heart of hearts is right. One must have compassion for others who make mistakes; only Christ was without sin. One must possess the trait of responsibility to one's self and family, always accountable for his actions. ACADEMICS

It hit me like a ton of bricks this morning as I sat down to write this on the day we returned from the Easter break – there are exactly four weeks of school left before underclassmen take exams, one week before our senior class of 2014 starts their final exams. Not sure if it is just me, but this school year seemed to fly by, which is surprising given the amount of academic change that occurred in the 2013-2014 school year. Actually, given the scope of many of the changes, we sailed right through and are ready for the changes to come next year.

While 2013-2014 was definitely the year of curriculum change and controversy across the country, for us here at Teurlings Catholic the changes were much less turbulent as a number of years ago we moved to acceptance of the ACT-based curriculum that the Common Core State Standards were written to match. I have not seen it widely noted in the media amid the storm over Common Core, but it is a fact that ACT and Common Core do correlate – and for us at Teurlings that is an important issue, since the majority of our students are college-bound, TOPS-seeking, and academically motivated – and want that ACT score necessary to accomplish those goals. For our students, the English/Writing/Reading standards mandated by Common Core were already in place in our English department, in many of our social studies classes, and are now also a focus in science. In math, our students have shown a steady increase in ACT scores, so our content was consistent with ACT standards; we have moved some skills to different grade levels and have added a focus on math terminology and what could be called “real world” or “work-ready” problems to match both the new ACT and Common Core goals.

There is still one more major academic change to come during the 2014-2015 school year, as the EXPLORE and PLAN Tests, as well as the Stanford used by our diocesan elementary schools, is discontinued and replaced by the ACT ASPIRE. We will give the ASPIRE for the first time in October to our 9th and 10th graders, while our elementary schools will administer the test (in some schools to all 3-8th graders, in others to 3rd, 5th, and 7th graders) next spring. We will also give the ACT to all our juniors on a regular school day next March, requiring the test for the first time.

For those of you confused by the new testing:

- The ACT is not changing format, at least at this time. From what I have learned in training sessions this spring, it is likely the ACT will be revised in the future and that a computer based version will also be available within 2-3 years. ACT score requirements for TOPS have NOT changed, so currently a 20 composite score is still the minimum requirement.
- The SAT, required for students attending many colleges and universities outside the South, is

changing their format, dropping some of the testing aspects (word analogies, for example) that made it different from the ACT. A few of our students take the SAT, especially those who plan to attend a northern university, and we offer the Pre-SAT (PSAT) to our juniors and sophomores interested in trying for a National Merit Scholarship. We will offer that test to 10-11th graders next October on a Saturday. Again, the PSAT will be optional next year, and will be administered on a Saturday.

- The ASPIRE is ACT's new test for grades 3-10. We are still exploring all the features of the test but did give an abbreviated “test” version last spring (2013) to some of our current 10-11th graders. The test is designed to be given on the computer, but a paper and pencil version is also available and we will utilize that next October when we give the test. What makes the test different from the old EXPLORE and PLAN Tests is the open-ended questions included, along with the traditional multiple choice format. Students are asked to answer many questions in essay form, even in math. Prior to testing next October, I will send sample questions and problems to parents, so you can see the new test format.

SUMMER READING

Information, including titles and book prices, for summer reading will be sent via email and old-fashioned handout to students and parents the week of May 12. Testing this year will be conducted in the summer on several different dates. There will be no testing in class at the beginning of the school year. Students who cannot test during the summer will be allowed to test on the first Saturday of the school year. Why? Because, most students took the tests over the summer, and we lost instructional time for a handful of students who still needed to take the test after school started. We will definitely expand the number of test dates available over the summer. Please remember that a student in a regular English class needs to read and test on one book, while honors and dual enrollment students must read and test on two books. Any student, regular or honors/DE, may read an additional book and take an additional test for an extra grade.

Seniors and Parents

Graduation will be here before we know it! So that you may begin preparations for the “Big Events,” please note the requirements to be met by each student in order to graduate and the dates and times for senior and graduation events.

Graduation Requirements

- ◆ All debts to Teurlings Catholic High School, including tuition and fees-for lost textbooks, library fines, and balances with the cafeteria, must be cleared before a senior will be allowed to take his/her exams, which begin on May 5, 2014.
- ◆ In order to receive a Teurlings Catholic High School diploma, a student must pass a total of 26 units including all state-required courses. A student who fails to qualify under this standard may participate in graduation exercises if, and only if, he/she passed a total of 23 units, including all state-required courses and Religion IV. Such students will not receive a TCH diploma, but a diocesan diploma.
- ◆ Any senior student who receives a grade of “Incomplete” in Religion IV or fails Religion IV for the year shall not be granted a TCH diploma and shall not participate in graduation ceremonies.
- ◆ Please refer to the TCH Student-Parent Handbook for clarification of the aforementioned requirements and policies.
- ◆ Any student who is determined by the sponsors, faculty, or administration to be under the influence of alcohol or any otherwise inappropriate substance during any school-sponsored event will not be allowed to graduate on stage or to participate in any other graduation event. Such students will also be subject to disciplinary action.

Dates and Times of Events

- ◆ **The Senior Liturgy** will be celebrated on Friday, May 2, 2014 at 8:20 a.m. in the school gymnasium. Family and friends are invited to join the seniors for this celebration. Seniors are to wear Sunday dress attire. The Senior Crawfish Boil will follow. Students may change into appropriate attire.
- ◆ **Senior Exams** are scheduled for May 5 – May 8, 2014. The schedule for exams will be announced for a later date.
- ◆ **Senior Awards** will be held at the Honor’s Ceremony, Sunday, May 18, 2014 in the TCH gymnasium. Attendance at this function is by invitation. **Dress Code: White Stoles** will be distributed in the gym lobby prior to the ceremony to all seniors receiving awards. (**No Graduation Cap**). **Girls** – Graduation gown, white stole, black sheer stockings, black closed-toe shoes (no slides, must have a back). **Boys** – Graduation gown, white stole, dark slacks and dark socks (blue, brown, charcoal, or black), dark dress shoes, a white shirt and an appropriate tie.
- ◆ **Graduation and Baccalaureate Mass Practice** will be held at 9:00 a.m. on Monday, May 19, 2014, at the Heymann Performing Arts Center. Attendance is mandatory for all graduates. Students should be aware that practice will last until rehearsals meet expectations for the final ceremony and, therefore, should not plan any other activities before 12:00 noon. White Stoles, Report cards, and picture forms will be distributed at this time.
- ◆ **Baccalaureate Mass** will be held at 5:30 p.m. on Monday, May 19, 2014, at the Frem Boustany Convention Center, which is adjacent to the Heymann Center. Graduating seniors are to report at 4:45 p.m. on that day. Attendance at this Mass is mandatory for all graduates. In order to graduate on stage, the student must attend the Baccalaureate Mass. **Dress Code: Girls** – Graduation cap and gown, white stole, black sheer stockings, black closed-toe shoes (no slides, must have a back). **Boys** – Graduation cap and gown, white stole, dark slacks and dark socks (blue, brown, charcoal, or black), dark dress shoes, a white shirt and an appropriate tie.
- ◆ **The 2014 Graduation Ceremony** will be held at the Heymann Performing Arts Center immediately following the Baccalaureate Mass. **Dress Code:** Same as Baccalaureate Mass. Girls will be given a class flower to hold and boys will wear a boutonniere. Beta Club, National Honor Society and Honor Graduates will receive additional accessories during the Convocation. These accessories **should** be worn Graduation night. No other decorations or flowers are allowed at the ceremony.
- ◆ **Graduation Seating:** Based on a decision of the board of Pastors and the Administration of Teurlings Catholic, graduation is a ticketed event. **Each graduating student will receive ten (10) reserved seats. More information on obtaining your tickets was sent home.**
- ◆ There is limited **wheelchair**  space. Please contact the Heymann Performing Arts Center to make arrangements prior to the ceremony.

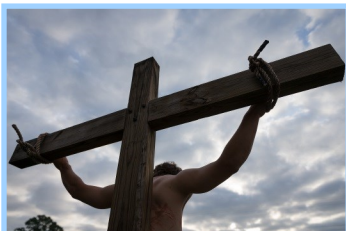
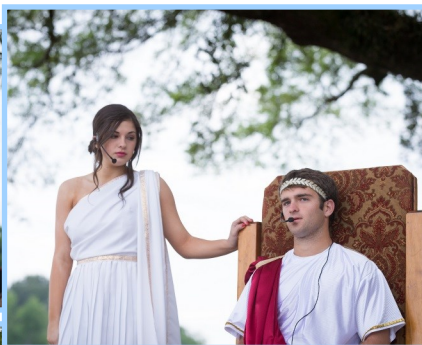
