From Our Principal...

Teurlings Catholic will be on Fall Break on October 17-18 and I know the students are excited about not having classes those days. On October 18, we will hold a Parent-Teacher Conference day. All teachers will be on campus from 8:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m., in their classrooms, to distribute report cards and meet with parents about the first quarter grades of our students. This is a great opportunity for parents and teachers to communicate with each other and structure a format for success for each and every student.

We are happy to announce Ms. Josette Surratt, TCH Religion Administrator, has been added to the Administrative Team. She will assume the position of Director of Faith Formation.

We have many opportunities to express our Catholic identity in October: Rebel Revival on October 5, Pro-Life Rosary on October 6, First Friday Adoration on October 7, Reconciliation October 12 and 26, Liturgies on October 13, 20, and 27, and the Sophomore Retreat on October 25. We invite parents to share these experiences with your children.

Many of you have been confronted with serious decisions regarding moral and ethical behaviors as planning for Homecoming 2011 has begun. Teurlings Catholic High School dances are an event, which reflects the philosophy of our school and the teachings of the Catholic Church. Among our most important considerations is adherence to Church teachings regarding modesty.

According to *The Catechism of the Catholic Church*, "Purity requires modesty. Modesty protects the intimate center of the person. It means refusing to unveil what should remain hidden. It is ordered to chastity to whose sensitivity it bears witness . . . Modesty is decency. It inspires one's choice of clothing. It keeps silence or reserve where there is evident risk of unhealthy curiosity. It is discreet . . . Teaching modesty to children and adolescents means awakening in them respect for the human person."

Before spending money on a dress, please make sure they meet school guidelines. We expect the highest standards of conduct for our students and will work hard to insure they know our levels of expectation. Dress

should be modest and tasteful, bodies should be chemical free, and dancing should be wholesome and acceptable.

There has been news lately in our area concerning violence on various school campuses. As you know we recently had a lockdown because police were in pursuit of three individuals. Video evidence shows at least one individual on our campus. Teachers, staff, and the students handled themselves very well and were out of harm's way very quickly. We will continue to practice various drills to insure the safety of our students and staff.

ACADEMICS

Here's my question of the month: were you pleased with your student's grades when we issued progress reports on September 9?

Keep in mind that progress reports are simply that – progress reports. The grades reported at 9 AM on September 9 were just a snapshot in time. By the time we finished school on that very day, the grades had already changed, thanks to the new assignments posted. Grades can improve dramatically (and quickly), with a little work on the student's part.

So, let's talk about solutions if you were not happy with the grades. I am sure that most of you check RenWeb regularly. If you do, then you have most of the information necessary to diagnose the problem with your student's grades. Are there zeros under homework? Are there partial grades under homework? Obviously a zero indicates the student did not do the assignment, but the partial grades also indicate that a student did not complete the assignment. Either way, those are easy points your student is not getting - and should be. There is no excuse for not completing homework. Homework points in most classes can mean a letter grade difference by the end of the quarter, either to a student's benefit or downfall. Completing all homework assignments WILL help balance out that one poor test grade. There are several things you, the parent, can do to help with homework completion. First, make sure you see your student completing assignments at home. Our teachers are assigning written homework and those assignments are listed on the teacher's RenWeb page. They are not assigning excessive amounts and the work is generally meant to reinforce what students are doing in class. Your student should also be seen frequently studying for tests, which is not the same as written homework.

If homework is not the problem,

let's look at the tests your student is taking. There are some tests that require strict and pure memorization. Those would include spelling and bell ringer tests in English, the periodic chart or elements in chemistry or physical science, prayers in theology, and map tests in social studies classes. The old verbal flash card review and writing the information over and over technique are still the best study methods for those types of tests. For other tests, memorization is not as important as being able to use the information. Going over notes repeatedly (and not just the night before the test but on a nightly basis), answering the questions at the end of the section and at the end of the chapter in the textbook, using the online study tools and reviews (as well as sample quizzes) posted by the textbook publisher are all good techniques to use. Directions for accessing the online versions of our math, science, social studies, English, and foreign language textbooks are located in the front of the books. There is one more type of test that is different from the others - the math test. How do you study effectively for a math test? You work problems. There are problems in the back of every textbook we use – problems that come with answers – and there are more problems online at the publisher's website, correlated to the textbook.

If books never come home (or if your student doesn't open a computer to access his/her text books) your student is NOT studying. As a parent, you are the only one who can decide if your child is trying to do too much at the expense of schoolwork. I am a firm believer in extracurricular activities and those activities themselves are usually not the problem. Clubs, organizations, community service and athletics teach valuable lessons to students and should be part of a well-rounded education. But, if a student is heavily involved in

extracurricular activities, he or she needs to understand that other activities, such as the cell phone, television, Facebook, video games, etc. have to be limited. Active students need to manage their time wisely. Sunday afternoon or evening should be reserved for getting a head start on the week's academic work.

Remember your parents telling you "you have to try and apply yourself if you want to succeed" back in your school days? True then, true now! It is a rare student who can go through high school without studying and completing assignments – so that should be the general rule of thumb for all parents: Students must study and must complete assignments to be successful.

Please remember, I am here if you have questions or need help with anything dealing with our academic program, as are the members of our guidance staff, Anna Proctor, Milton Rohm, and Dawn Aucoin. And, finally, please remember all teachers will be available for individual conferences on Parent/Teacher Conference Day, October18, when those first real report cards are issued.

COUNSELOR'S CORNER

- ✓ On Wednesday, October 12th, all 9th and 10th grade students will take the PLAN test. This is a practice ACT. Coach Milton Rohm will meet with all 9th and 10th grade students prior to the test. This is not only a great opportunity for students to practice ACT testing skills, but also helps to determine students' strengths and weaknesses. Also, these scores will be used to determine if students can be placed into honors courses the following year.
- On Wednesday, October 12th, all 11th grade students will take the Practice SAT test. The SAT test is a college entrance exam used especially for students wanting to attend college out of state. Taking the Practice SAT is a great opportunity for our 11th grade students to practice their test taking skills. Also, students who do exceptionally well on the Practice SAT are entered into a scholarship competition called the National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test or **NMSQT**. Mrs. Proctor will meet with the 11th grade students prior to the test to distribute practice questions and information about the test. We are proud to announce that Jon Melancon was named as a National Merit Semi Finalist. Good Luck Jon as you compete for a Finalist position.
- Mrs. Proctor will also meet with the 11th grade students to distribute an information booklet for juniors to refer to during the school year. All juniors are expected to take the ACT test at least once or twice during the school year. Students can register for the ACT at www.actstudent.org. Juniors will also be given a copy of their high school transcript and TOPS transcript. These transcripts can help students determine what they need to make this year to improve their grade point average and where they stand for TOPS at this point in time. Student's will also be given information on the Louisiana Core 4 Graduation/College Admission Requirements.
