he summer tan lines have faded, cool weather is just around the corner, and we are nearing the end of the first quarter of the school year. The first transition from summertime fun to academic success was measured with the posting of students' progress reports. Hopefully, the progress report grades have either brought greater effort for some or spurred others to maintain exemplary success.

Teurlings Catholic will be on Fall Break on October 14-15 and I know the students are excited about not having classes those days. On October 15, we will hold a Parent-Teacher Conference day. First Quarter Report Cards, Grades, and Parent/Teacher Conferences

Our first report cards of the school year will be official on Friday, October 11. You will be able to view, download and print the report card at 9 AM that day. As I am sure you know, we have our Fall Break for students on October 14-15, with Parent/Teacher Conferences on the calendar Tuesday, Oct. 15 from 8 AM to 2 PM. Our faculty members will be available to meet with you during those hours. I am often asked, "Is this mandatory?" and my answer is "no." If you are satisfied with your student's grades, you do not have to meet that day. However, everyone is welcome. I do strongly suggest and encourage you to attend if your student is struggling and that struggle was reflected on the report card with a grade of D or F. If you decide to attend, please bring a copy of the report card with you. We do not schedule appointment times so there may be a line when you visit, especially if you do so between 11:30-1:00 when many parents stop by on their lunch hour. We try to limit the visits to a maximum of 10 minutes, so that every concerned parent can meet with the teacher. If you cannot attend, feel free to email the teacher with your concerns and schedule a face-toface if necessary at a later date.

One last note on the subject of grades and report cards: obviously, if the student has an F in a subject, we have mutual concerns that need to be discussed. However, if your student, especially if that student is a freshman, is not quite doing as well as in previous years, don't panic. Remember that first quarter grade reflects the first few weeks of school, when students are adjusting to a new routine, new teachers and a new school or school year. Sometimes the straight A elementary student, by virtue of all the activities, classes and, admittedly, often harder subjects and work, earns a B or even two or three. While I'd like all students to be perfect 4.0 students, I know that is not always possible. Please be realistic. If you and your student are happy and he or she is working up to potential and juggling a couple of sports

and two or three additional extracurricular activities, then you have a good well-rounded student, even if there is a B or two on the report card.

Finally, look at things optimistically – we have three-fourths of the school, year left so there is plenty of time left, with effort, to improve ANY grade, literally, any grade, from F to B to 94/A. A study plan, reordering of priorities, focused preparation – all can help. Our guidance counselors are there to help you formulate a plan if necessary.

Computers, tablets and Promethean boards, oh my!

English IV students and teacher Carrieanne Ledet got an early Christmas present recently, when 31 Microsoft

Surface tablets with touch keyboards were delivered the classroom by to Technology Director Leslie Bergeron. The students will be using the tablets not only to write the papers required in the class, but for reading and research applications. With this additional purchase, we now have one-to-one computer capabilities in all English IV classes (both regular and dual enrollment) as well as all 9th grade English I classes (regular and honors), in

Dual Enrollment English III and in two of

our English II classes. The Surface tablets, along with three new servers, a set of Active Expressions for Amie Adams' math classes, three additional Promethean boards, and the installation of new fiber for the TCHS computer network, are all being financed through funds generated by our Silent Auction and Annual Appeal.

In addition to those purchases, TCHS was lucky to be the recipient of a state grant, facilitated by the Diocese of Lafayette that enabled us to add 53 HP Elitebook Revolve 810 tablets to our computing inventory. Those tablets came with two Promethean board systems, two laser printers, two ActiView cameras, ActivSlates, and stylus pens, enabling our upper-level math classes to join the one-to-one technology revolution. With an additional purchase of Math XL software and online textbooks. our Calculus, Advanced Math I and II, Honors Algebra II and one section of Algebra II are moving towards a paperless classroom. Those students are learning to take assessments on the computer, completing homework with Math XL, and in some cases (Advanced Math II and Calculus) sending assignments back and forth to Louisiana Tech for college credit.

- On Wednesday, October 16th, all 9th and 10th grade students will take the PLAN test. This is a **practice** ACT. Coach Milton Rohm and Mrs. Aucoin will meet with all 9th and 10th grade students prior to the test. This is not only a great opportunity for students to practice ACT testing skills, but also helps to determine where student's strengths and weaknesses are. These scores will be used to determine if students can be placed into honors and DE courses the following year.
- On Wednesday, October 16^h all 11th grade students will take the Practice SAT test. The SAT test is a college entrance exam used especially for students wanting to attend college out of state. Taking the Practice SAT is a great opportunity for our IIth grade students to practice their test taking skills. Also, students who do exceptionally well on the Practice SAT are entered into a scholarship competition called the National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test or NMSQT. Mrs. Proctor will meet with the IIth grade students prior to the test to distribute practice questions and information about the test.




