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## From Our Principal...

The Academic Pep Rally held on March 21 was a tremendous display of school achievement and talent. The theme was, "Wanted: Good Grades," and the Rebel Dome looked like a Hollywood set for Bonanza. At any moment we expected to see Ben Cartwright and the boys come out from behind the stage. The Rebel Dome was filled to capacity, the opening short film about the outlaw "Bad Grades" was fantastic, the program was exciting, the music added atmosphere, the entire faculty participated, and the students loved it. Our faculty members and parent volunteers are to be commended for orchestrating such a fabulous event. What a great way to spotlight the academic success of our students! Two hundred eighty-three students were recognized as XL award winners; that's $41.6 \%$ of the total student body.

Annually on Holy Thursday, we hold our sunrise Passion Play at 6:30 am. This is a great way to begin the most important four days in the Catholic Church and to share it with family. As in the past, our seniors elevate themselves as the spiritual leaders on our campus. All parents and families are invited to join us that day. The crucifixion will take place at approximately $7: 25 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$. and the resurrection will take place in the Rebel Dome approximately 10:55 a.m. on April 5.

The annual Grandparents' Mass will be celebrated on April 26 beginning at 12:15 p.m. Following the liturgical celebration, several of our students will entertain our guests with their vocal and musical talents.

April brings us prom activities as they relate to Teurlings Catholic. The following is our annual message to parents. When you set no curfew or if you allow your children to rent hotel rooms, sponsor after- parties where anyone who can open the ice chest or look over the bar counter can drink, and let them act as though they are consenting adults, you are gambling with your child's life. You are also gambling with the life of your neighbor's or your best friend's child at the same time. Our children are all underage and the state of Louisiana and the Federal government say they cannot legally consume alcoholic beverages. ## ACADEMICS

Sleep. Something we often take for granted until we don't get enough of it. Without a sufficient amount of sleep no species of animal, from the lowly mouse to the human, can function at full capacity. How many days a week do you, the parent, have to nag your student to get him or her out of bed in the morning? I see it every day here at school, in all our classrooms. Many of our students are struggling to stay awake and, when I ask the simple question, "what time did you go to bed," it's easy to see where the problem stems. The reply I get most often ranges from 11 p.m. to 1 a.m., depending on how active the student is in athletics and other extracurricular functions. So, if a student has to get up at 6 to get to school, it's not hard to do the math and figure out that many of our students are trying to function on 5-7 hours of sleep a night (which fits right in with the national average). Here are a few facts from the National Sleep Foundation at www.sleepfoundation.org:

Amount of sleep the average teen gets: 6 or 7 hours/ night

Amount of sleep teens really need: About 9 hours/night

Sleep debt: If a teen gets only 7 hours per school night instead of 9, his or her sleep debt for the week may be as much
as 10 hours (5x2).
OK, so it's not reasonable to think that the average teenager is going to go to bed at 9 p.m. and Daylight Savings Time certainly doesn't help (who thinks about going to bed when it is still light at 8 p.m.?) so what can you do? Here are some sleep tips from the National Sleep Foundation to help maximize the sleep your teen does get:

Limit colas, coffee, chocolate, and other sources of caffeine late in the day.

Make sure your teen takes some time to wind down before going to bed. A relaxed person sleeps better than someone worrying about the day's stresses.

Go into bright light as soon as possible after waking up and then try to dim lights during the evening.

Use the bed only for sleeping. Don't do homework in bed, or listen to music, or watch TV. And, make sure TVs, computers, phones are turned off or, even better, not in the bedroom at all.

SCHOOL BOARD ELECTIONS -2007
The TCH School Board serves as an advisory committee for the school. Board members may be elected by parents or appointed by pastors of the TCH owner parishes. Terms on the board require a three-year commitment.

This year, four vacancies exist. Two are appointed positions to represent St. Bernard Church and Immaculate Heart of Mary Church. Two are for members at-large positions. All parents of TCH students may vote to elect the member at-large.

Nominees for the at-large positions should be parents of children currently enrolled at TCH and are registered for the following school year. Nominees should be willing to make the necessary commitment of Time to Serve as an effective board member. The following individuals and their spouses are NOT eligible for board membership:
(1) Employees of the school
(2) Employees of an owner parish
(3) Persons who work at the school but are paid for that work by another group, agency, individual, or school system.

Please submit a brief bio of yourself. Include the name of your spouse and child(ren) with your child(ren)'s grade level(s). Additional information to include: church parish participation, community involvement and active interests in school activities. If you are a graduate of TCH, a statement regarding your Catholic school experience would also be appreciated.

## GRADUATION 2007

## Seniors and Parents

Graduation will be here before we know it! So that you may begin preparations for the "Big Events," please note the requirements to be met by each student in order to graduate and the dates and times for senior and graduation events.

## Graduation Requirements

$\square \quad$ All debts to Teurlings Catholic High School, including tuition and fees for lost textbooks, library fines, and balances with the cafeteria, must be cleared before a senior will be allowed to take his/her exams, which begin on May 7, 2007.
$\square \quad$ In order to receive a Teurlings Catholic High School diploma, a student must pass a total of 26 units including all staterequired courses. A student who fails to qualify under this standard may participate in graduation exercises if, and only if, he/she passed a total of 23 units, including all state-required courses and Theology IV. Such students will not receive a TCH diploma, but a diocesan diploma.
$\square$ Any senior student who receives a grade of "Incomplete" in Theology IV or fails Theology IV for the year shall not be granted a TCH diploma and shall not participate in graduation ceremonies.
$\square \quad$ Please refer to the TCH Student-Parent Handbook for clarification of the aforementioned requirements and policies.
$\square \quad$ Any student who is determined by the sponsors, faculty, or administration to be under the influence of alcohol or any otherwise inappropriate substance during any school-sponsored event will not be allowed to graduate on stage or to participate in any other graduation event. Such students will also be subject to disciplinary action.

## Dates and Times of Events

$\square \quad$ The Senior Liturgy will be celebrated on Wednesday, May 2, 2007, at 8:36 a.m. in the school gymnasium. Family and friends are invited to join the seniors for this celebration. Seniors wear Sunday dress attire.
$\square \quad$ Senior Exams are scheduled for May 7 - May 10, 2007. The schedule for exams will be announced for a later date.
$\square \quad$ Senior Convocation will be held at 3:00 p.m. on Sunday, May 20, 2007, at St. Bernard Catholic Church in Breaux Bridge. Attendance at this function is mandatory for all senior students. Seniors should arrive at 2:00 p.m. sharp. If a senior is not present at this function, he/she will not graduate on stage with the Class of 2007. Dress Code: Girls - Graduation gown, white stole, black sheer stockings, black closed-toe shoes (no slides, must have a back). Boys - Graduation gown, white stole, dark slacks and dark socks (blue, brown, charcoal, or black), dark dress shoes, a white shirt and an appropriate tie. (No graduation cap for this event, stoles will be given out prior to the ceremony.)
$\square \quad$ Graduation and Baccalaureate Mass Practice will be held at 9:00 a.m. on Monday, May 21, 2007, at the Heymann Performing Arts Center. Attendance is mandatory for all graduates. Students should be aware that practice will last until rehearsals meet expectations for the final ceremony and, therefore, should not plan any other activities before 12:00 noon. Report cards will be distributed at this time.
$\square \quad$ Baccalaureate Mass will be held at 5:30 p.m. on Monday, May 21, 2007, at the Frem Boustany Convention Center, which is adjacent to the Heymann Center. Graduating seniors are to report at $4: 45 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$. on that day. Attendance at this mass is mandatory for all graduates. In order to graduate on stage, the student must attend the Baccalaureate Mass. Due the limited seating capacity of the Convention Center, seating for the Baccalaureate Mass will be limited to immediate family of the graduates. Dress Code: Girls - Graduation cap and gown, white stole, black sheer stockings, black closed-toe shoes (no slides, must have a back). Boys -Graduation cap and gown, white stole, dark slacks and dark socks (blue, brown, charcoal, or black), dark dress shoes, a white shirt and an appropriate tie.
$\square \quad$ The 2007 Graduation Ceremony will be held at the Heymann Performing Arts Center immediately following the Baccalaureate Mass. Guests not present for the mass will not be admitted into the auditorium until after mass participants have entered, approximately 7:00 p.m. Attendance is, of course, mandatory. Dress Code: Same as Baccalaureate Mass. Girls will be given a class flower to hold and boys will wear a boutonniere. Beta Club, National Honor Society and Honor Graduates will receive additional accessories during the Convocation. These accessories should be worn Graduation night. No other decorations or flowers are allowed at the ceremony. To reserve a space for a wheelchair, please contact the Development Office Ext. 105. ANY POST-GRADUATION PARTY OR GATHERINGS.
