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## From Our Principal...

The Academic Pep Rally held on March 15 was a tremendous display of school achievement and talent. The theme was, "Good Grades Rock," and the Rebel Dome was rocking. A guest appearance by the band KISS, two of whom came into the Rebel Dome on the back of a Harley, excited all young and old alike. The stage looked like a rock concert, the Rebel Dome was filled to capacity, the program was exciting, the music added atmosphere, the entire faculty participated, and the students loved it. Our faculty members and parent volunteers are to be commended for orchestrating such a fabulous event. What a great way to spotlight the academic successes of our students! Two hundred sixty-six students were recognized as XL award winners; that's $40.2 \%$ of the total student body.

Annually on Holy Thursday, we hold our sunrise Passion Play at 6:30 a.m. This is a great way to begin the most important four days in the Catholic Church and to share it with family. As in the past, our seniors elevate themselves as the spiritual leaders on our campus. All parents and families are invited to join us that day. On April 13, the crucifixion will take place at approximately 7:25 a.m. and the resurrection will take place in the Rebel Dome approximately 10:55 a.m.

On April 25-26, a peer review team representing the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS), will visit our campus. The faculty and staff have been involved in the self-study process for the last eighteen months. Several of you may be called upon to visit with the peer review team.

The Senior Mass will be celebrated on April 27. All senior parents and families are invited to attend. After the liturgical celebration, the listing of all senior scholarship offers will be read to the entire student body. Following a donut and juice reception sponsored by St. Genevieve Middle, seniors will be treated to crawfish and all of the fixing.

April brings us prom activities as they relate to Teurlings Catholic. The following is our annual message to parents. When you set no curfew or if you allow your children to rent hotel rooms, sponsor after parties where anyone who can open the ice chest or look over the bar counter can drink, and let them act as though they are consenting adults, you are gambling with your child's life. You are also gambling with the life of your neighbor's or your best friend's child at the same time. When you let your children go to an after-party where drinking is condoned, even though you or other parents are present, you are gambling with your child's life, and with the lives of other children.

Teurlings Catholic does not sponsor, condone, or advertise any after party or drinking corresponding to any school activity. Parents who permit drinking by underage children are breaking the law. Our children are all underage and the state of Louisiana and the Federal government say they cannot legally consume alcoholic beverages. The school will notify the appropriate law enforcement agency of any planned activity associated with any school activity where alcohol may be present. Gambling is to take a chance. ## The finish line is in sight...

That's right, we are in the final stretch of the school year. Third quarter grades are now history and students should be gearing up for the final push of the academic year. Failure notices were mailed out March 24 to parents of students in danger of failing a course. Two things to remember in case you were the recipient of one of the letters:

- It's not the end of the world (even though we, as parents, always think it is);
- And, in most cases, hard work during the final quarter CAN change the outcome.

Please contact the teacher if you did get one of the letters. Monitor your student's progress this last quarter. Ask to see homework, check K-12 Planet, look for books and assignments, make sure there is a designated study time each day. You, the parent, are the person your child most respects in life and your support is generally what they need above all else when dealing with academic problems. Encourage your student - but stay on their backs, too!

For those of you who did not receive failure letters, please remember every year we see students in good academic standing at the end of the third quarter who fall behind and/or lose their TOPS eligibility because of the dreaded "senioritis." To paraphrase the great Yogi, "The school year is not over until it's over." Make sure your student works until the end.

Finally, if you need some help calculating your student's grade for the year, the two semesters are averaged to determine the year grade. The semester grade is the average of the two quarter grades multiplied by 2 and the semester exam.

Directions - without them we don't get very far in any activity, do we? Roadmaps, recipes, "how to" videos and books, assembly directions, prescription medicines...the list goes on and on. We
use directions of some sort every day of our lives. If you cannot follow directions, you will not be successful in your career, your relationships, and heaven knows you will never program that DVD/VCR recorder.

Students also follow directions. Every assignment issued to students in the course of a school day has specific directions that must be followed. Every athletic skill students learn on the practice field has directions that must be followed. Every dance move, every cheerleading skill, provide still more directions. Every rule and regulation set forth in the school's discipline policy adds more directions to a student's daily routine. Students have to learn to follow directions. Prior to the start of major academic projects, I see the directions issued to the students. The directions are always clear and can be easily followed. If students do not follow the directions, there are grade deductions. That is the way it has always been and the way it will always be. If the directions say that the paper must be $4-5$ pages long, it must be 4-5 pages long. If the directions say there must be four sources, there must be four sources. If the paper is due during second hour on Tuesday, the paper must be in the teacher's hand at that time. If the directions say that the paper must be documented parenthetically, it must be documented. Students are responsible for following the directions. If the student does not understand the directions, the time to ask for clarification is when the directions are first issued, not when the paper is handed back with all the corrections.

Parents, you can certainly help in this process. Ask to see the directions for major assignments and make sure your child understands what is required. Call the teacher immediately if you do not understand the requirements. I hate to see a student, especially one who has worked hard to complete a project or write a paper, lose points because they did not follow directions.

## SCHOOL BOARD ELECTIONS - 2006

The TCH School Board serves as an advisory committee for the school. Board members may be elected by parents or appointed by pastors of the TCH owner parishes. Terms on the board require a three year commitment.

This year, three vacancies exist. Two are appointed positions to represent St. Leo the Great and St. Genevieve Church. One is for a member at large position. All parents of TCH students may vote to elect the member at large.

Nominees for the at-large position should be parents of children currently enrolled at TCH and are registered for the following school year. Nominees should be willing to make the necessary commitment of time to serve as an effective board member. The following individuals and their spouses are NOT eligible for board membership:
(1) Employees of the school
(2) Employees of an owner-parish
(3) Persons who work at the school but are paid for that work by another group, agency, individual or school system.

Please submit a brief bio of yourself. Include the name of your spouse and children with your children's grade levels. Additional information to include: church parish participation, community involvement and active interest in school activities. If you are a graduate of TCH, a statement regarding your Catholic school experience would also be appreciated.

Please consider giving of yourself in service to the school as a board member. The deadline for candidate submission is April $13^{\text {th }}$. ## Seniors and Parents

Graduation will be here before we know it! So that you may begin preparations for the "Big Events," please note the requirements to be met by each student in order to graduate and the dates and times for senior and graduation events.

## Graduation Requirements

- All debts to Teurlings Catholic High School, including tuition and fees-for lost textbooks, library fines, and balances with the cafeteria, must be cleared before a senior will be allowed to take his/her exams, which begin on May 9, 2006.
- In order to receive a Teurlings Catholic High School diploma, a student must pass a total of 26 units including all state-required courses. A student who fails to qualify under this standard may participate in graduation exercises if, and only if, he/she passed a total of 23 units, including all state-required courses and Theology IV. Such students will not receive a TCH diploma, but a diocesan diploma.
