From Our Principal...

Teurlings Catholic sponsored its fifth annual "Walk for Life" on January 22, 2007. In past years, the march from the TCH campus to the Diocese of Lafayette was a visible sign of Catholic school children efforts to bring attention to Roe vs Wade, which made abortion legal in our country. Due to the threat of inclement weather, the march turned into a rally in the Rebel Dome where over 1,100 students from thirteen additional Catholic schools participated, along with many people from different civic and parish communities. The march was visible; the rally was personal. What a great way for our students to learn to stand as one for what they believe. Teurlings Catholic has been the leader amongst schools in protest against Roe vs. Wade and has inspired other schools to do the same in their own communities.

During February we celebrate the season of Mardi Gras. Lent is the season that prepares us for the Easter season when Jesus died for our sins, was buried, and rose from the dead. Mardi Gras is the season of carnivals, parades, alcohol consumption, and overindulgence. I encourage you to put this event in proper perspective for your children and to teach them what the season of Lent is about. A few years ago, on the Sunday before Mardi Gras, an area high school student died in a vehicular accident as the result of alcohol, directly related to pre- and post- parade celebrations. This year, our students' actions will be in direct proportion to the spiritual formation at home and school.

I hope that many of you find the opportunity to attend the school play, *The Secret Garden*, scheduled for performances February 1-4 at Angelle Hall on the campus of UL Lafayette. This is the tenth school production, giving our students another opportunity to express their God-given talents. Director Cody Daigle, Speech Coach Jossette Surratt, and the student cast and crew have been practicing since December. Whether or not you have a student actor, you will enjoy this performance.

The first semester grades showed that 57% of our students had a grade point average of 3.0 or higher. The spring semester brings many extra-curricular and curricular activities to the forefront in our students lives, but their focus should remain on their academic scores. 99.99% of our students become professionals in careers other than sports!

Congratulations to the Rebel Revue dance team for winning the Louisiana State Dance Championship in Hip-Hop and Jazz dance. The team will travel to Orlando the first week of February to compete in the National Dance Team Championship.

The Lafayette Daily Advertiser ran an article in advance of the pro-life march and interviewed our students. Senior Daniel Broussard said attending a school like Teurlings gives him more opportunities to get involved in causes he believes. Senior Joshua Fontenot said the school teaches more than academics. "Teurlings is a great school because they don't just teach you academics and athletics," he said. "They teach you values and character." I can't top that!

IT'S OFF TO THE RACES!


The second semester is well underway: Mardi Gras break is approaching; basketball, soccer and wrestling seasons are winding down; students are preparing for the spring sports; and everyone is looking forward to spring, sunshine, and warmer weather. In other words, the busiest time of the school year is upon us, and it conflicts with the season when the average student feels the least interested in being in a classroom, doing homework, or studying. Winter weather will turn to spring, the extracurricular activities really rev up, seniors especially begin looking forward to the end of the school year, and students are simply tired of school. Talk about a challenge for teachers and parents!

How DO you keep your student focused on the fact that the school year is nowhere near over? I wish I had some easy answers to give you but since each student is different, my best advice, from my own experience as a parent, teacher, and administrator, is to keep the communication lines open with your student. Let your child know your expectations. Check K12 Planet together with your child so you can discuss the grades posted and any problems you note, such as missed assignments. If your child knows you will monitor their academic progress on a regular basis, the student is more likely to keep up with assignments. Try to limit other activities. Is it really necessary for your child to stay up to midnight (or beyond) on the phone, text messaging, or on the computer? Does he or she really need to go out both Friday and Saturday night? Homework, tests, and studying will not ease up the second half of the year so a real balancing act needs to be worked out by you and your child.

If your student starts to slip academically this spring, take action quickly. Speak with your child and follow up with an email or phone call to the teacher. It would be a shame to see a good first half of the year erased by a case of spring fever.

GOOD NEWS

PLAN test scores were sent home to parents of 9-10th grade students with the mid-semester report card. Our 10th grade students scored well above the national norm in all phases of the test so we are extremely pleased. The test is given to 9th and 10th graders early in the school year. The national norms are based on 10th grade scores so our 9th graders are measured against 10th graders from throughout the country. I included the 9th grade scores so you can see the typical difference between scores at the two grade levels. Again, remember the 9th graders are being measured against 10th graders. As noted, our 10th graders are well above the national norms in all phases of the test. An explanation of the scores as well as predictions of individual student's ACT score potential was also sent to parents.

Students returning to TCH next school year will begin the scheduling process next month. Parents, please take time to go through the scheduling booklet with your student and help him or her select the courses that will best correspond with future plans and goals. There are some changes in the course selection and the honors course opportunities are being expanded.


