REBEL RESOURCE NETWORK SEMINAR ON EATING DISORDERS

We were fortunate to have Nicole Wynne, Eating Disorder and Nutrition Specialist, to come and educate our parents on January 15th. Mrs. Wynne informed us that of ten million young girls, one million will die from eating disorders. We do realize this is an ongoing problem in our schools today. She discussed anorexia, bulimia, and compulsive eating in teens and how these disorders are treated. Eating disorders are very hard to detect and hard for people to understand.

So many times a disorder is discovered in the late stages, making it more difficult to treat. These young women or men receive treatment mentally (dietitian), emotionally (psychologist) and physically (physician).

Some signs of eating disorders include:

- Isolation
- Depression
- Excessive exercise
- · Loss of weight
- Baggy clothes
- Strange food behavior (separating food)
- Calorie counting
- Hair loss
- Mood swings
- Sleep disturbances

If you are suspicious of someone who may have an eating disorder, please contact Milton Rohm (114) or Anna Proctor (108) for guidance.



ACADEMICS

I know that we are still deep into winter and the 2008-2009 school year seems far off in the distance. However, we are already preparing for next school year and you and your students will soon be doing the same as registration and scheduling are just a little over a month away. There are some important changes in the scheduling process this year, along with new electives and new guidelines for our special services program. Below are some of the highlights so you can start planning with your child now.

TCH Individual Student Needs Program

First, let me make it clear that we do not offer a special education program. We do not have the resources, facilities, or faculty to do so. The Individual Student Needs Program at Teurlings Catholic High School is limited to those students with a recent (no older than three years) professional assessment on file at TCH that confirms a diagnosis of a learning disability. Only a formal evaluation from educational diagnostician, psychologist, speech/language pathologist, reading specialist, or educational specialist in the field of learning disabilities, not a diagnosis from a family physician, is accepted. A family physician prescribes medication for ADD/ ADHD but cannot diagnose learning disabilities that affect the learning process. We do have policies and a program for dispensing medication for those students who require that treatment.

If you have questions about our policies concerning special needs, please speak with the coordinator of the program Shayree Latiolais (Ext. 202). We cannot accommodate the special needs of every student.

Electives and Elective Day

I am excited with the new courses we

are offering to our students for the 2008-2009 school year. We will offer two new business courses, Entrepreneurship and Business Law. A course in Introduction to Sports Medicine is also new, along with Sociology and Nutrition and Foods. While these courses, with the exception of Sociology, are not TOPS courses, we wanted to offer our students some additional choices, along with Art, our other business courses, Psychology, Interpersonal Communication, Speech, Publications, Newspaper, Physics, Anatomy, Biology II, Spanish, French, and Physical Education.

We are also excited to be able to offer additional courses through the Louisiana Virtual School. LVS is an online provider of courses, through the Louisiana Education Department, and offers, in addition to limited core courses, electives that most schools traditionally cannot offer. In the past, TCH students have completed courses in Latin I/II, Spanish III, Astronomy, Earth Science, Computer Science, Environmental Science, Webmastering, Digital Graphics and Fine Arts Animation, Survey, Developmental Reading Essentials, and Study Skills. In addition to those classes, LVS provides Advanced Placement classes in European History, Psychology, Macroeconomics, Microeconomics, and U.S. Government and Politics, as well as concurrent admissions classes where the student gets high school and college credit at the same time. Those college classes are offered in Advanced Mathematics, American History, English, and Fine Arts Survey.

On Friday, March 14, our 9th-11th grade students will attend our first "Elective Day." Teachers from our campus, along with LVS representatives, will present information to students on the available electives. Our students will be able to attend three presentations and learn more about our electives prior to turning in their schedule request.

Scheduling process

Mrs. Anna Proctor and Coach Milton Rohm, our guidance counselors, will present scheduling information to students the week of March 3-7 in classrooms. Students will receive a schedule request form which must be returned to the homeroom teacher on Wednesday, March 19. Schedules for next year will be issued in May and schedule changes will be handled the week of June 2-6.




