The information below indicates the 1st and 2nd Quarter differences in various student disciplinary violations/sanctions. The increase in many of the violations from the 1st to the 2nd quarter occurs as students 'get complacent' with school. The 1st quarter hair, sock, and belt violations for example – at the opening of school, everyone has taken the time to have their hair cut, correct shoes, and belts on pants. As the year unfolds, students get lackadaisical, complacent and let little things go by the wayside. In the position of Disciplinarian, I try to work with any student when extenuating circumstances allow. As I have told the students before "proper communications can go a long way in solving difficult situations." As parents, I am sure you understand and agree 'working with a situation' cannot be brought to the level of allowing repeated violations to continue.

Many of these violations can be eliminated through parents making students aware of their responsibilities related to haircuts, uniform regulations, tardies, etc. You can keep up with and monitor your student's behavior record on RenWeb (discipline tab). ACADEMICS

Marty Heintz - Assistant Principal

We will be in the midst of scheduling for the 2010-2011 school year in a little over a month. We are finishing our second year in the dual enrollment project. All of us - administration, teachers, students, and parents -- have learned much in the two years we have offered dual enrollment classes. The program has definitely required an adjustment in expectations for many students and parents when it comes to grades. After all, a sixteen-year-old high school junior is doing well to earn a "B" in a college-level English or history class. Workload-wise, it was hard at first for some students to find the balance with an English paper due each week or a fourchapter history test looming on the horizon when there was also a grueling sports practice schedule and a bunch of other extracurricular activities to deal with, not to mention five other courses that required attention. The program has some great benefits for our students but does require a major commitment and reasonable expectations. No, not every student ends up with an "A" in the courses - but those college credits, even when they are attached to a "B", are a valuable commodity at an average cost of \$35-\$40 a credit hour on the Teurlings campus. Tuition for a full-time student carrying 15 hours at UL this spring is \$2,010.85, according to figures posted on the UL website (http:// bursar.louisiana.edu/). As I have said many times, our goal is not to replace a student's freshman year on the college campus, but to provide a cushion that will allow a student to drop a class if necessary, maybe avoid a summer

session, or to keep them on track to get that degree in the four years that TOPS will cover. We are evaluating our dual enrollment program and considering some additions in French and Physical Education, but more on that next month! If, however, you have any questions on our dual enrollment program, please email me (mheintz@tchs.net) and I will be happy to discuss the program and the requirements for individual courses with you.

Now, however, is the time to start discussing next year's schedule with your student, regardless of what grade he or she will be in next vear. A challenging high school curriculum is the best preparation your student has for college. Encourage your student to look seriously at our elective offerings and to schedule not the "easiest" choices but rather the courses that will best prepare him or her for

college and beyond. If your student qualifies for the honors program and is willing to do the extra work required, then encourage them. Challenging coursework in the core courses (math, science, English, and social studies) along with improved reading comprehension, are the best ways to prepare for the ACT test - and we all know that ACT score is a key component of qualifying for the TOPS program.

If you have any questions about class scheduling, I encourage you to contact our guidance counselors Anna Proctor (11-12th grade) and Milton Rohm (9-10th grade). They are truly experts at navigating what I like to call "the TOPS jungle" and can guide you in the right direction. They will begin meeting with students in February to discuss scheduling. Mrs. Proctor is also planning informational sessions in March for parents.

Attention Seniors: Remember to complete your FAFSA form online at www.fafsa.ed.gov. This is the TOPS application and also the application for receiving any kind of federal or state aid that you may qualify for. Only students who complete this FAFSA and meet the TOPS requirements will receive the award. The deadline to complete the FAFSA is July 1, 2010, however I encourage you to complete the form by the end of April. You will need to include your tax information even though TOPS has nothing to do with family income. If you have any questions, please feel free to call Anna Proctor at 337 235-5711 ext. 108. Juniors need to apply to take the ACT test in April if they have not already done so. There are only two left this year and I encourage each Junior to take the ACT at least two times prior to their senior year. Any **Sophomore** interested in taking the ACT can stop by the guidance office for details on how to apply.

During February Mrs. Proctor will meet with all the 9th, 10th and 11th grade students to distribute Honor's Applications for the 2010-2011 school year. Students' currently enrolled in an honors course may continue taking courses in that subject area if they are in good standing (a 1st Semester grade of an A, B, or C). Students who are not currently in honors and would like to apply must complete and turn in an application in to the Guidance Office by the deadline listed on the form.

 $\sqrt{}$ During March we will meet with all $9^{th} - 12^{th}$ grade students to discuss their 2009-2010 class schedule. Those forms will be due back during March and must be signed by a parent.

TCH ADVISORY BOARD ELECTIONS - 2010-2011

The TCH Advisory Board serves in an advisory capacity to the Chancellor, responsible for presenting an annual operating budget and recommending board policies for the school. Parents elect at-Large Board Members, and the Priest from each TCH owner parish appoints a Member. Terms on the board require a three-year commitment.

This year **four vacancies** exist. **Two** are pastor appointed positions to represent the following church parishes: St. Bernard and St. Leo the Great (one year remainder of a three year term). **Two** are member at-large positions. All parents of TCH students may vote to elect the member at-large.

Nominees for the at-large positions should be parents of children currently enrolled at TCH or accepted for admission for the following school year and registered for the following school year. Nominees should be willing to make the necessary commitment of time to serve as an effective board member. The following individuals and their spouses are NOT eligible for board membership:

Employees of an owner parish


Persons who work at the school, but are paid for that work by another group, agency, individual, or school system.


