## DISCIPLINE

Starting in January parents will have access to their child's conduct record through K-12 Planet. Please make sure that you take advantage of this opportunity. I do not call home every time a student is tardy or when they receive a uniform violation or detention. It will be very helpful for you to be able to check on their discipline status. Many students do not inform their parents when they get written up for minor violations. Here are some helpful tips:

* Excessive Tardies - This means that the student has gone over the limit (three) for the quarter. For tardies over the limit, I usually send home a paper to be signed and returned. If you haven't signed one, you may want to call me. We can tell you what classes, days, and times, your child was late.


## * Uniform Violations -

 This means the student has served an after school or morning detention for a particular uniform violation. Three violations of the same nature result in a Saturday School.
## Gum/Food/Drinks

 These violations result in a morning or after school detention. Three violations of the same nature result in a Saturday School.* Grooming - This code is for an unshaven face, hair too long, or long sideburns. These violations result in a morning or afternoon detention. Three violations of the same nature result in a Saturday School.
* Codes - Every violation has a different code in our system. So if you are confused about an infraction, please call me to help clarify the meanings of these codes.

I am very excited that parents can now check on their children's grades and conduct records. So if your child has been telling you he/she has been going to early morning tutoring, or staying for tutoring, you may now realize that he/she may have had some detentions you didn't know about. All this is new to everyone, so please don't hesitate to call if you are not clear about an infraction.

## ACADEMICS

## Marty Heintz - Assistant Principal

Just prior to the Christmas holidays we received the PLAN test scores (our standardized testing) for our $9^{\text {th }}$ and $10^{\text {th }}$ graders. Those scores will be included with the midterm report card that parents will receive the second week in January.

PLAN gives us a report on the overall scores for the $10^{\text {th }}$ grade, which I have charted below. Individual scores are also reported for both $9^{\text {th }}$ and $10^{\text {th }}$ graders. As you can see from the chart, our $10^{\text {th }}$ graders scored well above the national average in all areas.

As a parent, I'm sure you want to know what your own child's individual scores tell you. If your student is a $10^{\text {th }}$ grader, compare the $9^{\text {th }}$ grade scores you received last year to this year's scores. Did your child's score improve? Most of our students' scores did improve. The score report also includes a predicted ACT test score range, based on the PLAN score, for your child. This is an important piece of information for you and your child. The highest TOPS awards go to students with a 27 or higher. Remember that in order to be eligible for the lowest TOPS award, your child must reach a certain level on the ACT. Currently that mark is a 21. If the prediction for your child is not in TOPS range, you and he/
she now know what academic areas need remediation. PLAN scores are used for placement into honors courses here at Teurlings and should also be used by the parent and student in planning next year's academic schedule request. Remember that in addition to an acceptable ACT score, TOPS awards are based on completion of mandated curriculum, as well as a GPA of 2.5 (3.5 for the highest award) or better in that mandated curriculum. Finally, the student interest survey included in the program can help you and your child look at future careers the student may want to explore, based on his/her interests.

As academic assistant principal, my job is to compare the current $10^{\text {th }}$ grade scores with the scores of the same students in $9^{\text {th }}$ grade, looking for improvement. The $9^{\text {th }}$ grade scores reflect what students learned in their respective elementary schools. However, comparing the $9^{\text {th }}$ grade test scores to the $10^{\text {th }}$ grade scores, tells us if a student progresses here at Teurlings. You, the parent, can do the same with your child's scores, not only from $9^{\text {th }}-10^{\text {th }}$ grade, but also by comparing that PLAN test score from the $10^{\text {th }}$ grade to the eventual ACT score.

## 2005-2006 APPIICATION AND EnROLIment PROCESS

## APPLICATION

All $8^{\text {th }}$ grade students are required to apply for admission next year. Applications will be sent home with $8^{\text {th }}$ grade students at our feeder schools, on January 6 $6^{\text {th }}$. Please return the completed application and required documents by January $31^{\text {st }}$. Failure to do so will result in the application being returned to you for completion, thereby delaying the admissions process. Siblings of students currently enrolled at TCH must follow these same procedures and comply with the deadlines. Failure to remit a first-priority application by the deadline will result in the student being placed with those on a waitlist. Due to the volume of applications, all deadlines will be strictly enforced. Letters of acceptance for registration will be mailed out by mid-February.

Enrollment packets for our current $9^{\text {th }}, 10^{\text {th }}$ and $11^{\text {th }}$ grade students will be mailed the first week of February. While re-application is not required, the below registration dates do apply.

## REGISTRATION

Registration will be held on March $2^{\text {nd }}, 3^{\text {rd }}$, and $4^{\text {th }}$. It is mandatory that parents register their students within the specified dates to assure their enrollment status.
