# Helpful tips if your teen is going to a party:

- 1. Make sure there will be parental supervision and no alcohol will be served. A tactful call to the host may be advisable.
- 2. Know where your daughter/son is going and with whom. When taking your teen to a party, go to the door and introduce yourself. If you already know the family, at least wait until your child is inside the house.
- 3. Make it easy for your teen to leave a party. Agree that they can call you (or another adult) to come for them if there is any reason why staying is uncomfortable.
- 4. Urge your teen NEVER to ride home with a driver who has been drinking.
- 5. Be awake to greet your teen when they come home.

# **ACADEMICS**

# **Marty Heintz - Assistant Principal**

"A new year, a new start" - we've all heard this, over and over, every January. I like to look at education as the one field where you get two fresh starts. Think about it students (and teachers) start a new year every August and get to start another new year in January. It gives us all two shots at changing things that need to be changed. I like to think of myself as an optimist, so I really like the idea of being able to make two sets of resolutions and fresh starts each calendar year. Hopefully, you and your student will also look at the beginning of 2008 with the "glass half full rather than half empty" sentiment. Our students have half a year left to change the course of their academic careers if necessary. Even a small change for many students can have a profound impact on the GPA and test scores. Every student at Teurlings, from the student with the perfect 4.0 GPA to the student who is worried about passing a course or graduating, can benefit from some small changes or goals that can have a major impact. Encourage your child to pick one of the following and resolve to really focus on the goal throughout the second semester:

- Read for half an hour every day. School assignments don't count; this needs to be extra reading practice. It really doesn't matter what he or she reads, and, yes, the newspaper and *Sports Illustrated* are good choices. All the research says the same thing students who read score higher on the ACT and other standardized tests.
- Use the agenda and write down every assignment. Then,

refer to the agenda every night and complete the assignments. Homework points lost kill many a student's grade, while homework points from completed assignments often result in a higher letter grade. If you keep up with K-12, you know in most classes homework is generally the equivalent of a letter grade in the course of a quarter.

- Rewrite notes and review them nightly. Does your child wait until the night before a test to try and learn an entire chapter? Simply rewriting the notes and reading over them nightly can make a big difference in the amount of time required to study the night before a test and the quality of that study.
- Organize study materials. If a student can't find the notes or the homework or the study guide well, you get the picture. Get a new, big binder, and looseleaf paper in different colors, and dividers to organize so nothing gets lost. The different colored paper you can find at the discount and drug stores will really help with organizing notes.
- Turn off the TV, radio, cell phone, and computer during study time. Kids don't focus when they are listening for the sound of a friend texting or instant messaging. As adults, we know all too well how distracted we can get if the television is on while we try to work on something. Turn them off. Start small, with half an hour each night of time devoted to study without distraction.

Small goal, big results. What do you or your child have to lose?

# 2008-2009 APPLICATION & ENROLLMENT PROCESS

#### APPLICATION

On January 7th, applications will be sent home with 8th grade students at our feeder schools. Please return the completed application and required documents by January 31st. Failure to do so will result in the application being returned to you for completion, thereby delaying the admissions process of your child. Siblings of students currently enrolled at TCH must also follow these same procedures and comply with the deadlines. Failure to remit your child's application by the deadline will result in the student being placed with those on a waitlist. Due to the volume of applications, all deadlines will be strictly enforced. Letters of acceptance for registration will be mailed out by mid-February.

Enrollment packets for our current 9<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> grade students will be mailed the first week of February. While reapplication is not required for current students, the below registration dates do apply.

#### REGISTRATION

Registration will be held on March  $5^{th}$ ,  $6^{th}$ , and  $7^{th}$ . It is mandatory that parents register their students within the specified dates to assure their enrollment status.






