## From Our Principal...

In all the Catholic schools throughout the Diocese of Lafayette, a budget is prepared, tuition adjusted, and receipt of admission applications is completed in January each school year for the following year. This year, we budgeted to accept 170 freshmen students for the 2008-2009 school year. The applications exceeded available space and not everyone who sought Catholic education was admitted to Teurlings Catholic. Family situations often change so those students on the wait list may have the opportunity to be accepted. To date, the freshman and junior classes are full and both have a waiting list. To guarantee your position, it is important to participate in the registration process taking place March 5-7.

The building of the new classroom wing has placed students and teachers in technologically sound and comfortable classrooms. The construction of the athletic facility has provided our students with a viable space to dress and a safe place to work out. We will continue to upgrade our campus through the capital campaign as we prepare for the future. A future that will see increasing interest in Teurlings Catholic.

We have begun the planning stage to build an athletic stadium on our campus. We will be searching for volunteers to assist us with this planning stage of the process and thank those whom have already volunteered.

We have so many things to celebrate as a school community. The Rebel Revue dance team competed in the National Dance Team Championship in Orlando, Florida, and placed 8th in the nation in Hip-Hop and 14th in Jazz. Danielle Cottonham placed 3rd in the Harvard National tournament in Interpretation; Danielle and Blake Flugence placed 3rd in Duo Interpretation; and Arielle Latiolais placed 8th in Interpretation. The boys' soccer team won the Division II state championship, a first in school history. Our girls' basketball, girls' soccer and boys' soccer teams won district championships. The recent production of Seussical the Musical was a tremendous display of the theatrical and musical talent that we have on our campus. The wrestling team finished third in state, in a higher division than in previous years; Ian Darby was an individual state champion and the team scored the most points ever in the championships. On March 12, at 12:15 p.m., we will celebrate the academic accomplishments of our students with the annual Academic Pep Rally. The theme is "Laissez les bon grades rouler," let the good grades roll.

I would encourage you, as we continue the season of Lent, to spend time as a family to pray, play, and work together. Spending time with your children will make memories that will carry them into adulthood and parenthood. We hope that you will join us on March 20, Holy Thursday, as our senior class sponsors the annual Passion Play beginning at 6:45 a.m.

## SCHOOL BOARD ELECTIONS - 2008

The TCH School Board serves in an advisory capacity to the Chancellor, responsible for presenting an annual operating budget and recommending broad policies for the school. Parents elect At-Large board members, and the Priest from each TCH owner parish appoints a board member. Terms on the board require a three-year commitment.

This year five vacancies exist. Four are pastor appointed positions to represent the following church parishes: Immaculate Heart of Mary (two year remainder of a three year term), St. Elizabeth Seton, St. Peter, and St. Leo the Great/St. Patrick (one year remainder of a three year term). One is for a member At-Large position.

All parents of TCH students may vote to elect the member At-Large.

Nominees for the at-large position should be parents of children currently enrolled at TCH or accepted for admission for the following school year and registered for the following school year. Nominees should be willing to make the necessary commitment of time to serve as an effective board member. The following individuals and their spouses are NOT eligible for board membership:
(1) Employees of the school
(2) Employees of an owner parish
(3) Persons who work at the school but are paid for that work by another group,
agency, individual or school system.
Please submit a brief bio of yourself. Include the name of your spouse and children with your children's grade levels. Additional information to include: church parish, participation, community involvement and active interest in school activities. If you are a graduate of TCH, a statement regarding Catholic school experience would also be appreciated.

Please consider giving of yourself in service to the school as a board member. The deadline for candidate submission is March $10^{\text {th }}$. Send your information to the front office at school or fax it to 337-2348057, ATTN: School Board.

## Where do you go for help?

It is down to crunch time for some of our students and their parents. If your child is struggling academically, here are a few things you can (and should) do:

1. Talk to and listen to the teacher. Our teachers really do care about your children and are there to help you help your child. No, it is not about extra points. Rather, the teacher is the one who sees your child in class every day, who knows the strengths and weaknesses of each child in the class and is the person who can tell you what he or she needs to do to improve in the subject. Be open to the teacher's suggestions and try them.
2. Talk to and listen to your child, with reservations. Remember that students don't always see their own shortcomings, and to a typical teen, looking over notes right before a test constitutes "studying." Rather than asking your student the age-old question, Did you study?, be observant and watch her study, look over his homework when he finishes, help her by providing a good study area with few distractions, and make sure he finds a good balance between schoolwork and extracurricular activities.
3. If you've gone through the suggestions above and still see no improvement, call either me (Ext. 103) or Guidance Counselors Anna Proctor (Ext. 108) or Milton Rohm (Ext. 114). While none of us are miracle workers, we can provide additional suggestions on an individual basis for you and your student. Please do not call us however, until you have first spoken with the teacher. When a child is struggling, our teachers want to help. If you have a question about their grading policies, tests,
homework, classroom management or any other issue pertaining to their teaching, please call them. They will NOT hold it against your child! Like everyone, our teachers would much rather hear about your issue from you personally, than to have you go to a superior first. Most problems are really just simple miscommunications that can easily be remedied.
