



SUMMER READING

And Books Too will be on campus on Tuesday and Wednesday. May 20-21 so students can purchase the books required for summer reading. All students are required to read at least one of the grade-level novels during the summer and take an objective test on the book. Those students in Honors English must read a second, specified book, in addition to one of the two regular selections. Students may also read an additional grade-level novel and take a second test for extra credit. We try to make it convenient for parents and students by offering testing three times during the summer, as well as in English classes during the first week of school.

Testing this summer will be conducted on Wednesday, June 11, Wednesday, July16, and Wednesday, July 30. The tests will be given at 10:00 AM in the school library. The tests are Scantron, therefore students must bring pencils.

Now, on to a more pertinent topic: EXAMS!!!

It is hard to believe the school year is approaching an end, but it is and exams are right around the corner. Senior exams begin Monday, May 5 with the third and fourth hour exams. Seniors need to be on campus at 8:45 AM that day, as well as Tuesday and Wednesday. The Tuesday exams are first and second hour; and Wednesday's exams are sixth and seventh hour. On Thursday, May 8, seniors need to be on campus at 10:00 AM for the fifth hour exam. Seniors do not need to be on campus when they do not have an exam scheduled.

Underclassmen exams begin on Monday, May 26. Students in grades 9-11 will take their seventh hour exam at 7:30, followed by regular classes for 1st-4th period the rest of the day. On Tuesday, May 27, the first and second hour exams will be administered. On Wednesday, May 28, the third and fourth hour exams will be given and on Thursday, May 29, the fifth and sixth hour exams will be

administered.

Students are expected to be here when their class is scheduled to take exams. We do not move exams simply to make things more convenient for students. However, if there are extenuating circumstances (for instance, if an older sibling is graduating from college out of town) the student needs to see me as soon as possible to make arrangements prior to absence.





Graduation 2008

Seniors and Parents

Graduation will be here before we know it! So that you may begin preparations for the "Big Events," please note the requirements to be met by each student in order to graduate and the dates and times for senior and graduation events.

Graduation Requirements

All debts to Teurlings Catholic High School, including tuition and fees-for lost textbooks, library fines, and balances with the cafeteria, must be cleared before a senior will be allowed to take his/her exams, which begin on May 5, 2008.

In order to receive a Teurlings Catholic High School diploma, a student must pass a total of 26 units including all state-required courses. A student who fails to qualify under this standard may participate in graduation exercises if, and only if, he/she passed a total of 23 units, including all state-required courses and Theology IV. Such students will not receive a TCH diploma, but a diocesan diploma.

Any senior student who receives a grade of "Incomplete" in Theology IV or fails Theology IV for the year shall not be granted a TCH diploma and shall not participate in graduation ceremonies.

Please refer to the TCH Student-Parent Handbook for clarification of the aforementioned requirements and policies.

Any student who is determined by the sponsors, faculty, or administration to be under the influence of alcohol or any otherwise inappropriate substance during any school-sponsored event will not be allowed to graduate on stage or to participate in any other graduation event. Such students will also be subject to disciplinary action.






