

- If you have a party at your house and alcohol is available, you are legally responsible for every child there as well as when they leave.
- .02 is the legal limit for a teenager to be considered "under the influence." This level could be reached by drinking about a half a can of beer.
- Make sure when you are out of town, teenagers don't use your house as a meeting place. Ask your neighbors to call you if they see cars at your house.
- Curfew for anyone under 17 is 11:00 p.m., even on Saturdays and Sundays.
- Dig through your child's room, car and book bag regularly!
- Cell phones allow teens to have friends that you will never know about, so check their cell phones often.
- Don't be a buddy or friend to your child, you are supposed to run interference in their lives.
- If you have a hunch something is not right with your child, you are usually right; don't let up.

Contact the school to see if they have noticed anything.

If your child is willing to take

a drug test when you question him, then go through with it. The line "Let's go right now," is a last ditch effort to persuade you to trust them and not go through with it. Most parents feel guilty and don't follow

through, and the child wins.

- There are many ways your child can get around drug testing. There are drinks, pills, and devices that help alter the test, and are very easy to get. If you do want to test your child, don't tell him/her, just bring him/her to a testing facility, or use a home test kit right away.
- Feel free to call the school and ask Mrs. Baudier to place your child in the random monthly test if you are uncomfortable doing it on your own.
- Check out the website www.theantidrug.com for any kind of information you want on any kind of drug. It tells you what drugs are popular and what to look for.
- Check your medicine cabinets to make sure all of your prescription pills are there. Make sure you watch your child take his Ritalin. Crushing and snorting this drug is very popular among teens.

- ~ Reminder to all **seniors** applying for scholarships, deadlines begin in November.
- ~ The next scheduled **ACT test** is on December 11th. Deadline to apply is November 5th. Teurlings is not a testing site for the December test.
- Practice SAT. The test was administered on October 13th. The results for the PSAT test should arrive sometime in December. Mrs. Proctor gave each junior a booklet entitled "Getting a Jump Start". Please review this information with your child. There are several suggestions and tips on how juniors can better prepare for their senior year and the important decisions that they will encounter. It is our suggestion that the juniors take the ACT test at least twice this year. The juniors were also given a copy of their TOPS core GPA. We reviewed which courses they are currently enrolled in that will apply toward their TOPS core GPA. They will receive an updated worksheet at the start of their senior year. The overall GPA listed on the report reflects all the courses that they have taken.
- ~The **PACT/PLAN test results** should arrive in December. These results will be mailed to parents along with the 1st semester report card in January.


