The friends of Teurlings Catholic High School are wasting no time in meeting the Capital Campaign's fundraising goal for 2005. Your generous contributions are making a substantial impact on the continued success of our vision to improve our facilities as we Grow In Faith Together (GIFT).

We have the necessary funds to begin construction on the New Classroom Wing and much-needed renovation of the old Jr. High classrooms very soon. These improvements will enhance the educational environment of the school and strengthen its ability to attract and retain quality students and faculty.

During this last quarter of 2005, we are moving into **the next phase of our campaign, The Athletic Complex, Football Stadium, and Track.** We have already begun the earth-work in preparation for the construction of the Athletic Complex. In order to begin construction, **we need to raise approximately \$250,000** to supplement the \$200,000 already earmarked for this project. The future Athletic Complex (to be located behind the existing gym) will house a weight room, training room, locker room, and shower/laundry facilities, as well as offices for coaches and staff.

Many people think that only large, extraordinary gifts count in a capital campaign-or only gifts of endowments or buildings. This is not the case. Absolutely everything counts! Donors to Teurlings Catholic High School are special people to whom we all feel an enormous debt of gratitude. GAMBLING: IS YOUR CHILD AT RISK?

At the end of last year, there seemed to be a craze in card playing. Students were trying to play cards every free minute of the day, and I realized that it was becoming a problem. Although cards are not allowed on campus, students tried to play and keep track of points and after school they would settle their debts or collect their winnings. Our SADD sponsor, Mrs. Kim Hardy, sent me an article that she came across in one of the club newsletters; it made me realize just how serious this problem was among high school students today. The article, "Risking It All: What Teens Need to Know About the Rise of TV Poker d Internet Gambling" (De oring 2005) is about a teen yot hooked on Texas Hold Em, rom watching Poker on TV. The teen started out playing on Friday nights with friends, then it became a couple of nights a week, and he eventually turned to online gambling sites losing up to \$7000 in one night. What starts out as a pretty innocent card game for some can turn into a serious addiction for others. Parents need to be aware that there is a fine line between playing cards for fun and playing out of control. Several seniors last year told me that they had won or lost \$200 -\$300 in one night playing cards with friends, and they would play all night long on a school night. Another scary thought is that anyone can get online and bet with a valid credit card number regardless of his or her age. The Federal Trade Commission has issued a strong warning to parents

and teens about the dangers of online gambling. If you need more information, or help, please go to www.gamblersanonymous.org.

CAMPUS THEFT

It is hard to believe

that students steal from one another at a Catholic school, but it does happen. Within the last two weeks, several students have had watches and/or money taken from their book bags or clothes while at P.E. or practice after school. I constantly remind students not to leave money or valuables hanging around. Every student has a locker with a lock on it to keep all valuables safe. Students in P.E. classes have been told by their teachers not to leave valuables in the dressing rooms and have even offered to lock up items in their offices while in P.E. class. It is up to the students to be responsible for their valuables (gloves, bats, practice gear, cash, jewelry, etc.). I truly wish that I could say that everyone here is honest and trustworthy, but unfortunately that is not the case.

We had a spectacular turnout for Parent-Teacher Conference Day, especially in the lower grades. For some reason, we normally do not have the numbers turn out for the junior and senior classes as we do for the ninth and tenth grades. For the record, 45 of our 678 report cards were not picked up. This means 94 percent of our parents picked up report cards! While not every parent met with teachers, the positive feedback I received from the faculty was that they saw the parents they felt they needed to see, which is fantastic. When a student is not doing well academically, that contact between parent and teacher is vitally important in helping to resolve the situation.

The make-ups are given in the library, beginning at 9 a.m. each day so students who are taking the makeups will miss classes. subjects. The only exceptions are in Athletic PE, Acting II/III, Yearbook, and Newspaper. Students in every other course must take a midterm exam and that exam grade counts for one-fifth of the student's semester grade or one-tenth of the total year grade, if you prefer to see the value that way. In other words, exams are serious business on the TCH comprehensive, covering all material taught during the semester. Exams are objective (multiple choice, matching, true/false, etc.) and subjective (essay questions, short answer). In English and Social participating in a state writing grant, the essay portion of the exam will be completed ahead of time so that all our classes can use the state grant computers. However, the objective portion of the exams for those classes will be administered




