From Our Principal...

My how time flies. One year ago, in the November 2005 edition of the *Rebelation*, we announced that we had the necessary funds to begin construction on a new classroom wing and renovation of the existing junior high wing. The construction work lasted longer than was anticipated, but you know what they say about those who wait. These improvements will enhance the educational environment of the school and strengthen its ability to attract and retain quality students and faculty seeking a Catholic educational experience.

Your generous contributions are making a substantial impact on the continued success of our vision to improve our facilities as we Grow In Faith Together (GIFT). Much of the athletic complex has been completed and the weight room has been in use since late June. We anticipate the locker room facility to be completed by the end of the current football season and will be available for use by the boys soccer, wrestling, and indoor track teams. The athletic complex (located behind the existing gym) will house a weight room, training room, locker room, and shower/laundry facilities, as well as offices for coaches and staff.

If that was not enough campus construction, the renovation of the existing weight room into girls and boys basketball locker rooms has been completed. This will allow us, over the course of the school year, to renovate the physical education locker room facilities, for both girls and boys. Much of that work will be done with good old elbow grease.

Now that the speech department has relocated into the new classroom wing, we will be restoring the Chapel to its original purpose. Once completed, the Chapel will allow us to hold daily morning prayer, rosaries, prayer services, and days of reconciliation. If you have the skill, or more importantly the time, to help with this, please give School Board Facility Committee Chairperson David Guidry a call and volunteer your time when he schedules workdays.

Upcoming events include All Saints' Day Liturgy at Calvary Cemetery, Blood Drive, Sophomore and Junior Retreats, 8th Grade Day, Open House, TCH Girls Hoopfest Basketball Tournament, Thanksgiving Mission Trip, TCH Feeds the Hungry on Thanksgiving Day, Advent

Prayer Services, Adopt-A-Family for Christmas, Immaculate Conception Mass, Live Nativity Prayer Service and semester examinations. This listing clearly reflects the excellent job being done by the faculty and students at TCH and their commitment to and cultivation of their faith and special gifts.

The spirit of our student body, through some hard times this year, has been truly remarkable. Sculptor Henry Moore (1898-1986) said, "One never knows what each day is going to bring. The important thing is to be open and ready for it." A MESSAGE TO PARENTS FROM SADD:

The members of SADD (Students Against Destructive Decisions) at Teurlings Catholic would like to take this opportunity to ask you as parents to join us in the fight against destructive decisions. Teen drinking has become an escalating problem, especially here in the heart of Louisiana. Our culture is one that promotes a lifestyle that condones alcohol consumption. This way of life becomes a hazard when parents endorse underage drinking. From the article "Message in a Bottle," in the October 4th edition of The Independent, Ken Benedik, a UL Lafayette health instructor, explains that alcohol is a depressant that slows the function of the central nervous system, and because teens are still developing physically they are particularly vulnerable. When intoxicated, teens as well as adults are more likely to make destructive decisions. SADD acts as a support system for good decisions. The Independent also reports: that teens who drink are more likely to be sexually active and have unsafe, unprotected sex; that half of drowning deaths among teens are alcohol related; and that alcohol use increases the chance of them being involved in a homicide. SADD is asking you to join our movement to fight underage drinking. We are encouraging vou to talk to your children about the brutal truths of drinking. It is very important that the good example starts at home. Many parents encourage their children not to drink and drive, which is a step forward, but how about encouraging them to not drink at all?

ACADEMICS

For many students, **EXAM** is a true four-letter word, especially at the freshman level where many have never before encountered a semester exam. At TCH, exams are given at the end of both semesters and those exams are comprehensive – in other words, the exam covers everything presented in the class during the semester. Exams at Teurlings count for one-fifth of the semester average or one-tenth of the year average, so they are important. Students who have learned the material as it was presented by the teacher throughout the semester usually have no problem with semester exams. The student who has memorized something for a test and promptly forgotten it afterwards tends to panic when semester exams roll around. I wouldn't call it impossible, but it is truly difficult to relearn an entire semester's worth of material in the night prior to the exam.

The wise student prepares for exams throughout the semester by making an effort to retain the material learned. Since we're parents and realists however, we understand that most students won't plan that far in advance. There are some things students and parents can begin to do now, a month before exams, to start getting ready:

- ° Gather up tests the teacher has returned to the student. Those tests form the basis for a good study guide for exams.
- ° Start making flashcards of vocabulary words and important facts now.
- ° Spend a few minutes each night reviewing material from earlier in the semester.
- Make sure the student stays current on assignments and makes up all work promptly when absent.
- ° On the night of a test, go through notes and highlight items that were on the test.
- Look at the family calendar and make sure the student will have study time the week before and during exams. Cancel activities that are unnecessary those weeks.
- ° Make sure the student has a place where he/she can study undistracted by TV, radio, the cell phone, and instant messaging.
- o If the parent has not already done so, schedule a conference with the teacher if the student is struggling in a class. The teacher will provide you with information that will help your child achieve success.
- ° Finally, and this one is common sense, make sure the student gets a good breakfast and a good night's sleep each day during the exam period.


