From Our Principal...

During the month of November, the Administration and School Board is charged with the task of setting tuition for the upcoming school year. Few decisions facing school administrators and school boards require as much courage, perspective and sensitivity as setting the school's tuition rate. Administrators across the country struggle with this question: How do we provide a quality Catholic education for all families without depleting the families' limited financial resources?

Tuition increases annually because expenses increase annually. The Teurlings Catholic faculty is an incredibly dedicated group of men and women who work for salaries which are far less than their counterparts in the public school system receive, and the gap is ever widening. Although we can't pay them what they would receive in the public system, we need to keep their salaries as competitive as possible, and of course, we need to give them salary increases which reflect the cost of living.

Starting salary at Teurlings Catholic with zero years of experience and a Bachelor's degree is \$25,865.00. During this current school term, our faculty receives the following percentages of the salary which their counterpart with the same degree and years of experience receives in the area public school systems: Iberia Parish 63% (\$40,800.00); St. Martin Parish 64% (\$40,256.00); Lafayette Parish 67% (\$38,408.00); St. Landry 70.3% (\$36,756.00); and Vermilion Parish 73.5% (\$35,154.00). Because of the obvious financial opportunities, it will become increasingly more difficult to attract, as well as, retain quality teachers.

Our present structure of tuition payment does not meet the cash flow requirements of the school. Teurlings Catholic does not have any significant cash reserves nor a significant endowment. We function off our annual income, and our annual income does not always coincide with our expenses. It is for this reason that it is so incredibly important that all parents pay tuition in

a timely manner. All of our financial policies are geared towards insuring that tuition is paid on time, so that the school can meet its monthly financial obligations.

The educational implications for your child are obvious. If Teurlings Catholic is to remain the excellent school that it has always been, it must be a forward looking and energetic institution. The administration and school board have accepted the charge to develop a plan that will ensure the continued success of our school. We will try to keep tuition as moderate as possible to meet the resources of our families, but tuition will increase every year to meet the financial needs of the school.

ACADEMICS

Exams, homework, and grades – three words that can strike terror in the hearts of students, parents, and teachers alike. Since this is the last newsletter prior to the end of the first semester, I feel it is time to look at those three terror-invoking items. And, since homework has a direct influence on grades and an indirect influence on exam performance, let's start there.

HOMEWORK

I conducted an unscientific poll in senior and freshman classes, asking the students to rate 7 common (but generally not liked) tasks typically completed by high school-age students (doing the laundry, cleaning their room, taking care of brothers/sisters, etc.) as well as three school-related tasks (completing written homework, studying for a test, completing a project/research paper). The students put the 10 tasks in the order they'd prefer to complete them. Want to know the "task" your kids typically prefer to do? Seniors consistently chose "go to the dentist" over all chores and homework. Freshmen prefer a chore (mowing the grass, taking care of brothers and sisters, or cleaning something) but again, the three school-related tasks came in dead last. Surprised? I'm not because I have access to teachers' grade books, and I know not completing homework is the number one problem our teachers battle in the classroom, followed closely by students not studying for tests. I also figured projects and research papers would come in dead last, again because I listen to students (and parents) complain about having to complete them.

NO ONE LIKES HOMEWORK! Teachers hate it because it has to be graded and it is a constant battle to get students to complete it. Parents hate it, again because it is a constant battle to get your kids to do it. Students, well, they'd rather do just about anything other than homework, even babysit that six-year-old brother who annoys them! However, homework is a necessary evil. Let's face it — we all learn with practice. So, homework is not going to go away. All our students have homework on a nightly basis. If you never see your child doing any homework or never studying for a test, there's a problem.

EXAMS

Just to answer the question, yes, our students are required to take comprehensive mid-term and final exams in every subject except athletic PE and senior Theology. The exams cover all material presented in the semester.

If this is your first go-round with comprehensive exams, here are a few study tips that you can use with your child:

- Encourage your child to go back to notes and highlight information that was tested throughout the semester. Chances are it will be on the midterm or final, too.
- The old flashcard trick you used with your child to learn the multiplication tables or vocabulary words back in the primary grades is perfect for reviewing material for exams.
- If the teacher returns tests, make sure your child keeps them and uses them to study for exams.
- If a study guide is provided, check to see that your child completes the guide themselves (not copying someone else's answers) because research has proven that if a student looks up the answer themselves he or she is much more likely to remember that answer.
- Use the textbook and make sure your child can answer the chapter review questions for all chapters covered during the semester.
- Finally, schedule family activities around exams so that your student has time to study. Don't plan that big family reunion or weekend trip for the weekend before exams start. Make sure that studying is the first priority.

Exams at Teurlings are worth 1/5 of the semester grade, so exams are important.

GRADES

The first quarter is now history and we are well into the second quarter. I was very pleased that 90% of parents picked up report cards on Parent-Teacher Conference Day, and many of you took the time to speak with teachers. I know there were some long lines; I appreciate the fact that many of you waited out those lines. Thank you! Personal contact with a teacher is important. Not only does it show your concern to the teacher and provide you with feedback on how your child can improve the grades, but it also sends the right message to your child. If Mom or Dad is willing to give up time to go and see a teacher, then school must be important.

If you have not contacted a teacher yet about any problems your child may be facing academically, now is the time to do so. Keep the lines of communication open. You can call the teacher's voice mail extension (listed in the handbook and student agenda, as well as on our TCH website) or email the teacher. Our teacher addresses are simple: the first initial and last name of the teacher at tchs.net. If you have trouble connecting with a teacher, let me know.

TOUR de FORCE

We are very proud of our faculty and staff. Many have achieved status above and beyond the call of duty; all are terrific with the students. This column is designed to feature accomplishments of those faces on campus.






