Student Parking

Our parking lot is full. At this time we are in the process of looking at a few options to add a parking lot and possibly create a new entrance/exit into the back of school. This would alleviate some of the cars going through the front drive. All juniors and seniors and a handful of sophomores who are currently driving received a parking spot. Our goal is to create enough parking space for the students who will need a spot before the end of the school year.

Student Drop Off / Pick Up

We still have several parents who are trying to avoid the car line by dropping off or picking up students by the front office. We also have parents hiding their cars in the student lots and faculty lots to avoid the line. Please adhere to the drop off/pick up guidelines, or we will assign the students a Saturday School.

Drug Testing

We have begun our drug testing program. Students are randomly chosen by social security numbers to be tested. Students are given the test by the technicians at Lab Express. Parents will be notified of the results by mail within 2-3 days of the test. If further testing is required, it could be up to a week before results are given. Students who are tested because of suspicion can be tested at any

time and will be informed. Parents will be contacted about the suspicious reasons for the test. If any parent wants their child to be tested, please contact me at 235-5711, ext. 102. For more information please read your handbook, pages 52-53.

K-12 Planet

Please check your child's discipline record through the K-12 Planet program. I don't call home or send home notes for minor infractions like tardies, gum, or uniform violations, unless they become habitual. Please call if you need any infraction explained (ext. 102).

Teasing/Bullying

If your child is getting teased, please call us and let us know. It is very important to us that your child feels safe at school, but more importantly, happy. We can find ways to deal with this, without letting your child know you have called. You owe it to your child to speak up and not remain silent no matter what they tell you. Please also encourage them to come forward on their own, to either the disciplinarian or one of our counselors. This is the first step in helping them to defend themselves. Counselor for grades 9 & 10: ext. 114, for grades 11 & 12: ext.108, and the disciplinarian: ext. 102. We can't help if we don't know!



ACADEMICS

Welcome to **Lauren Schomaker**, who will teach Physics, Math II, and two Chemistry classes for us until Dominican in New Orleans reopens.

I find myself writing a version of this column every year around the time the first progress reports are issued because, students have their beginning of the year "adjustment" challenges. If your student's grades were not what you wished on the progress report issued Sept. 16, take action, but don't panic! Progress reports, as I tell our students, are just that - progress reports. By the time the progress reports reach your house, the grades have already changed as additional assignments have been recorded. Progress report grades allow you and your student to assess the situation while there is still time to fix problems. In addition, freshmen face the challenge of adjusting to high school and all the changes that come with the exit from the middle school campus; sophomores run into some difficult subjects, and they are more rigorously challenged (i.e., biology and geometry); juniors get the keys to the car for the first time; seniors are already counting down the days to graduation...you get the picture.

What can you, the parent, do if the grades were not as good as you would like?

- Discuss the grade with your student. You might be surprised how honest your child will be, especially if you frequently have these heart-to-heart talks. Your student may honestly tell you he/she didn't turn in some homework, blew off a test, or, as is the case many times, needed a few weeks to adjust to a new schedule, new teachers, and a new school. The comment posted on the progress report for each class by the teacher is another tool for discussion with your student.
- Follow up. Check K-12 Planet and the grades for yourself. If you did not ask for a code for K-12 Planet, contact Anna Proctor, guidance counselor. Grades are updated every other week and you can tell if your student is not turning in assignments and remedy that situation quickly. Not only can you check grades on K-12 Planet, but discipline records are also available.
- Tell your student to approach the teacher after class, at lunch, before school, or after school to find out what he/she can do to improve the grade. This may also be a good time to speak with your child about how to approach a teacher correctly, asking for, not demanding, a good lesson in life skills.
- If the situation does not appear to be improving, contact the teacher. Leave a voice mail for the teacher and allow a day for him/her to respond; with the rotating schedule, some days the teacher has no planning period to return calls. If you have trouble reaching a teacher, leave a voice mail at my extension (103) and I will make sure the teacher gets the message.
- Make sure you see textbooks and work at home. All of our teachers assign homework. EVERY STUDENT SHOULD BE STUDYING FOR TESTS.

- Encourage your child to take advantage of the tutoring sessions many of our teachers hold prior to tests. In addition to the after-school assistance offered by math teachers, this year the math department is also providing, for a small fee, regular math sessions after school. Last year parents asked for math tutoring, as math is an area where many students fall behind. Information on these math sessions is listed below and may be obtained from the math teacher.
- Make sure your student is taking advantage of all resources open to him/her. Your student can also speak with the guidance counselor (Mrs. Proctor for grades 11-12 and Coach Milton Rohm for grades 9-10) for help in developing good study habits.

Above all, hard work and study cure most academic problems.


