## From Our Principal...

The 2006-2007 school year will mark the beginning of the sixth decade that Teurlings Catholic has provided a quality Catholic education to students. Over thirty-five hundred graduates have prepared the foundation that our students follow today. Our students this year and for years to come will have the opportunity to utilize new classroom and athletic facilities. We are just a few short weeks away from moving into the new classroom space and athletic complex. Construction and renovation have moved slower than we had anticipated. Our students and faculty have been extremely flexible and understanding these first few weeks of school. We will announce a formal dedication of the new building when we can appropriately forecast a completion date.

We would like to welcome several new faculty and staff members to the family of Teurlings Catholic. Mrs. Lisa Taylor is now our Business Manager, a position she filled over the last week of May. Mrs. Taylor comes to us from the Academy of the Sacred Heart where she worked in the finance office for fourteen years. Her son, Dane, is a junior at TCH. Mrs. Leslie Bergeron comes to us from Trinity Catholic, where she was an assistant principal. She will be teaching computer application and theology. She is the mother of TCH alumnus Derek and current junior Drew. Ms. Anika Beaux, TCH alumnae of '99, joins our mathematic and theology departments. Mrs. Liz Synder, daughter of TCH faculty member Josette Surratt, enters into her first year of teaching in the theology department. Mrs. Synder will also serve as our music minister. Mr. John Frugé, joins our staff full time teaching public speaking and coaching our debate team. Mr. Frugé was on campus last year as a long term substitute during two faculty maternity leaves.

Three important dates are on the calendar for the month of September. Progress reports will be sent home on Wednesday, September 13; ask your students to see the copy. On Thursday, September 14, following a prayer service, the Fall Academic awards will be distributed to qualifying students. On Wednesday, September 27, at 6:00 p.m. in the Rebel Dome, the guidance department is sponsoring a meeting for all senior parents to share information regarding scholarship and TOPS opportunities.

Assistant Principal Terri Baudier and Business manager Lisa Taylor have exchanged offices. Please report to the front office for all financial business. Assistant Principal Marty Heintz is sharing space with Mrs. Baudier until the classrooms are completed. She will then move to the office building behind the chapel. We have made these changes to facilitate the distribution of students on campus due to the additional classroom space.

We have experienced numerous changes to our campus since last May. All have been put into place for the betterment of the educational process for our students. One thing that will never change, however, is that Teurlings

## TIPS FOR FRESHMEN PARENTS!

Welcome to all of our new freshmen parents! If you have had a child attend TCH previously, welcome back! When a student enters high school, it can be just as scary for the parents as it is for the student. I put together some tips to help you through the first few months, and hopefully help your child have a great start!
\#1) Read the School Newsletter. Everything you want to know (and sometimes don't want to know) is in the monthly newsletter. It is packed full of information that parents need to know. You can find out when grades come out, what time dances end, who to contact for assistance. In addition, you receive an updated monthly calendar.
\#2) Get your Child Involved. If your child has too much free time on his or her hands, this could lead to trouble. Don't be afraid about your child balancing school work, sports, and clubs. Clubs and sports teach them to be more responsible and organized. Going home and watching TV every day teaches them to be lazy. Your children will only get out of high school what he or she puts into it! Check out our school handbook for the many extra curricular offerings - and we do have a lot of them!
\#3) Friends. Know with whom your child is hanging around and don't be afraid to ask questions. If they ask to spend a night, call the parents and ask about the friend's curfew and restrictions. If your child gives you a story, check it out!
\#4) Communication. Nagging or asking a million questions is not communication. LISTEN. Let your child tell you about his or her day on their own. Let them know that you are interested in what they have to say, even if it isn't juicy gossip. You will find they will enjoy sharing things with you more often.
\#5) Set Expectations. Talk to your child about the pressures of sex, drugs and alcohol. Let's face it; it's everywhere. Most students feel that their parents have no clue about what goes on and some may be right. Keep educated about popular drugs and what goes on today, and talk to your child about these issues. Tell them often about your expectations. Don't just assume they know. Check out www.theantidrug.com for lots of useful information.
\#6) Go with your Gut! If you notice any major changes in grades, grooming, hygiene or attitude, don't brush it off as normal teen problems. If the change is big enough to notice, recognize it and get some help from the school. If progress reports or report cards seem too good to be true, call the school and double check. Don't ignore anything that you find suspicious. Usually, your first instinct is right, because you know your child better than anyone else.
\#7) Valuables or \$. Do not allow your child to bring valuable items or large amounts of money to school. We do have occasional theft, especially in the locker rooms. All students have a locker with a lock, and can keep equipment, valuables, jewelry and money locked up during lunch and P.E. classes. Thieves can only steal what is lying around, so part of the responsibility is on the student. Better safe than sorry!
\#8) Uniform. Check your child's hair and uniform to make sure they are following the dress code. If in violation, they will get written up for detention or even Saturday school. Let them know you support the school rules.
\#9) Parental Involvement. Join us for our school Mass on Thursday mornings, attend athletic events and special functions, or join a parent group. Even though your child may act like he/she doesn't want you here, it means a lot to see you around!
\#10) Bullying. If your child is coming home from school or practice upset because of teasing or bullying, please let us know. The only way we can handle the situation is if we know about it. Please call me at Ext. 102 and we will try to solve the problem in a way that is best for your child. We do not tolerate bullying or harassment on our campus.

## It's off to the races!

The school year has just started, but before you know it, we will be counting down the days until May, graduation, and summer vacation once again. Every year I like to remind faculty and students alike that there is no other profession where you literally do start over each and every year as you do in education. Whether it is a teacher facing new students or students facing new teachers and classes, every year is different and a new beginning. What happened last year is old news and students have a chance to erase mistakes they may have made in the past year. And, that's the way I like to look at it, rather optimistically. Even if things were not so good academically last year, here's an opportunity to start over. Encourage your student to remember that and to treat the start of the school year as a new beginning, a clean slate, and the beginning of a great future.

## Where's my classroom?

Parents, rest assured, your children adapt to new situations much better than we think! As your students have no doubt told you, our new classroom addition was not ready for the start of school thanks to some construction delays. As a result, everyone, teachers and students alike, had to start the year in temporary quarters. It was amazing how smoothly our first week went, despite the fact that few teachers were located in the rooms listed on the student schedules, or that lunches were also switched around at the last minute. Very few of our 680 students were lost or went to the wrong lunch. It helps reassure all of us that, when they leave the nests here at school and at home, our little birds will survive and not get lost.

We will go through the moving process twice more this year, once when the new building's 13 classrooms are ready and again when the theology building's five rooms are completed. Each and every one of our students will have at least two classes in the new buildings, since all social studies and English classes will meet there. The new classrooms are gorgeous, bright and HUGE!

## Progress reports and report cards

Our first quarter progress reports will be issued to students on Wednesday, September 13. There is no reason why your student will not bring home the official printed progress report on that date!

First quarter report cards will be issued on Monday, October 16 , which is also our parent-teacher conference day. No first quarter report cards are issued to students. The report must be picked up by a parent or guardian. Why? Because we feel strongly, as a school, that doing so helps us to establish the lines of communication with parents. All of our teachers will be on campus from 11:00 a.m. to 7 p.m. to meet with you and discuss the progress of your student. You are not required to meet with the teachers, but this is a day set aside for you to do so. Even a quick "hi, call me if you need me" is appreciated by the teachers. See you that day!

## AHERA Asbestos Management Plan

The Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act of 1996 (AHERA) mandates that all Local Education Agencies have all their facilities inspected for asbestos and that a Management Plan be developed. The Management Plan illustrates the location of Asbestos Containing Materials (ACM) and describes the course of action to take in regard to managing this material.

Since 1994, all diocesan schools have had a prepared AHERA Management Plan which is available for review at the Principal's Office. Teurlings Catholic has been inspected by school staff every six (6) months and reinspected by a Certified Management Planner every three years, most recently in 2005. There were not any abatement projects or response actions taken the previous school year, 2005-2006.

## Alergic to Pesticides

If your child is hyper-sensitive to the following pesticides used on the Teurlings Catholic Campus, please notify Ms. Collado in the front office. Pesticides: Cypermethrin, Cvanomethyl, and Diphacinone.

## Immunizations

State Law requires all students enrolled in school must take Booster immunizations every 10 years. Once your student has taken his/her booster immunizations, please send an updated record to the front office.

This is to inform you that AHERA Compliance Management Plans are available for public inspection in either the principal's or coordinator's office of each school site in the Diocese of Lafayette School System. These documents include the Inspection Reports, Reinspection Reports and the Management Plan. Requests to view these may be made Monday Friday during regular school hours.

Inspections of Asbestos Containing Material (ACM) are made by each school every six (6) months. Every three (3) years, re-inspection is conducted by a Certified Asbestos Inspector/Management Planner.

- On Wednesday, September $27^{\text {th }}$, there is a mandatory Senior Parent Meeting at 6:00 pm in the Rebel Dome. We encourage at least one parent to attend. Mrs. Proctor will discuss ACT/ SAT testing, college admission procedures, searching and applying for scholarships, TOPS and much more. Parents will be given a variety of information to help with these topics. Each student and parent will be given a copy of their overall high school transcript from the Louisiana Department of Education and a TOPS transcript so that each student can see where they stand at this point.
