### From Our Principal...

The Teurlings Catholic family has returned to start another academic school year. Family is defined as “a group of persons related by blood, marriage or similar commitment.” Our family’s commitment to a quality Catholic education is our common denominator.

We would like to welcome several new faculty and staff members to the family of Teurlings Catholic. Mr. Brian Bolner joins our maintenance staff and will also serve as equipment manager for the athletic department. Mr. Tony Courville will serve as a teacher/coach, moving here from Carencro High. Tony’s daughter Michelle was a 2006 graduate of TCH. Mr. David Faber, Class of 2001, joins our mathematic and religion departments and will coach soccer. His brother, Chris, is a sophomore. Mrs. Brandy Courtney joins our science department and will teach chemistry and physical science. Brandy attended an all girls catholic school in Memphis, TN, and received her undergraduate degree from Loyola in New Orleans. Mrs. Nicole Frey joins our social studies department and will teach history and psychology. She is a graduate of Archbishop Chappelle in New Orleans, and she taught at her alma mater and has been a substitute teacher at St. Pius X and Teurlings Catholic. ## DISCIPLINE

**Welcome back!** I hope everyone had a productive summer and is ready to get back into the routine; I know I am. To new students and parents, I hope you will become involved some way at our school, even if it is in some small way. The first few days of school have gone really well. The students have been a pleasure!

**Here are a few reminders to help make everyone's school year a positive one:**

- o Remind your child to lock his/her locker at all times.
- o Cell phones are only allowed in lockers or cars. Students are not allowed to carry them in purses, bookbags, or on them – NO EXCEPTIONS!
- o Please pick up your child by 3:00pm. We have no duty teachers after this time, and students are not allowed to roam the campus.
- o Please do not call about parking spaces for sophomores. Announcements are made to students referring to when and where they can get a tag. Also, students may inquire about tags in the front office. Sophomores may purchase a tag when they begin to drive, but not before.
- o If a student checks out, he cannot check back in without a doctor's note.
- o If your child is getting harassed or bullied, please call Terri Baudier at ext. 102 or Milton Rohm at ext. 114.
- o If your child is absent, please call (ext. 0) or fax (234-8057) the front office before 8:30 a.m.
- o If your child will be arriving at school after 7:50 a.m., you must call (ext. 0) or fax (234-8057) the front office.
- o All students should be appropriately dressed every day.

### **Drop Off/ Pick Up**

Please be patient in the car line. Once everyone learns the routine, traffic will flow much smoother. The most important things to remember are:

- o Use the exit lane to exit only – students are not allowed to get into cars in the exit lane.
- o Pull all the way up as far as you can, do not stop by the chapel to drop off your student.
- o As soon as you stop, your child should quickly exit your vehicle.
- o Tell your child to be waiting and looking for you in the afternoon, as to not hold up the line.
- o Parents are not allowed to park in the student parking lot or faculty lot to wait for students.
- o Parents are not allowed to drop off or pick up students by the front office and gym unless you are coming into the office for business.

### **RESPONSIBILITY**

When students reach high school we need to let them become more responsible as they begin the journey toward adulthood. ## ACADEMICS

### Way to go, class of '07 and faculty!

ACT released its annual "scorecard" in August and that brought some great news to Teurlings. Not only did the class of '07 show a significant increase in all facets of the ACT, but Teurlings scored above the state average in all phases of the test and above the national average in English, reading and the composite. We are only 1/10 off the national score in science and, while our math score is still below the national average, it increased by 1.3 points. Here's how our scores compared with the state and the nation:

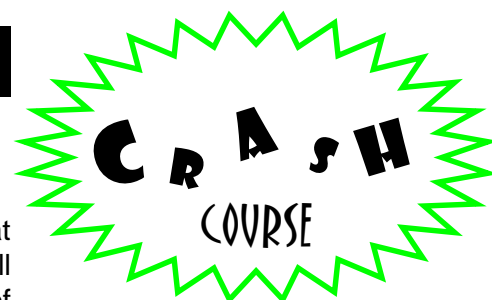
166 of our 170 graduates took the test, or roughly 98 %, compared to 1.3 million or 42% nationally. ACT also uses the last test a student takes to figure the scores, not a student's best testing. Colleges and universities use the student's best scores, regardless of when they were taken. Our guidance department tracks our students' scores on every ACT attempt and our composite based on the student's best scores is a 21.895! We are now in the third year of the writing program adopted by our English and Social Studies Departments and are beginning to see the payoff in higher scores, not only in English, but in reading and science as a result. Math, too, is improving thanks to some strengthening of our core courses.

The scores recorded by the class of '07 should be a challenge to our current students, a challenge they can meet and exceed.

### New start, new beginnings

If you are the parent of a junior or senior, you've heard some version of what I am going to say before because I try to repeat the message at the beginning of every school year. There is no other situation in life when one can truly say "it's a new year and I am starting over and the past doesn't matter." Your students are lucky because that is the reality for them. New teachers, new subjects, and the opportunity to take a new path academically provide the opportunity for a student to forget about the mistakes of the past and start fresh. The student who did not do as well as the student (or his or her parents) wanted last year truly has an opportunity to start over. I like to tell the seniors that they have one year left to improve their academic average; to the juniors, I say their high school careers are not half over, but optimistically half begun; sophomores have three-fourths of their high school careers left to correct mistakes; and, to freshmen, elementary is history, high school is now!

Encourage your student to look at this year as a new beginning.

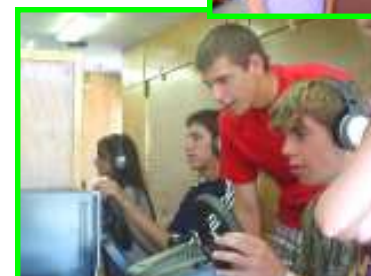


### The Crash Course Trailer Visited TCH for a Trial Run!

### AHERA Asbestos Management Plan

The Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act of 1996 (AHERA) mandates that all Local Education Agencies have all their facilities inspected for asbestos and that a Management Plan be developed. The Management Plan illustrates the location of Asbestos Containing Materials (ACM) and describes the course of action to take in regard to managing this material.

Since 1994, all diocesan schools have had a prepared AHERA Management Plan which is available for review at the Principal's Office. Teurlings Catholic has been inspected by school staff every six (6) months and reinspected by a Certified Management Planner every three years, most recently in 2005. There were not any abatement projects or response actions taken the previous school year, 2006-2007.

If your child is hyper-sensitive to the following pesticides used on the Teurlings Catholic Campus, please notify Ms. Collado in the front office. Pesticides: Cypermethrin, Cvanomethyl, and Diphacinone.

### Immunizations

State Law requires all students enrolled in school must take **Booster** immunizations every 10 years. Once your student has taken his/her booster immunizations, please send an updated record to the front office.

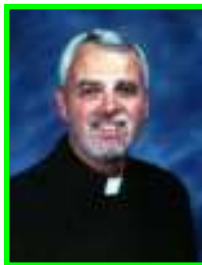

Inspections of Asbestos Containing Material (ACM) are made by each school every six (6) months. Every three (3) years, re-inspection is conducted by a Certified Asbestos Inspector/Management Planner.
